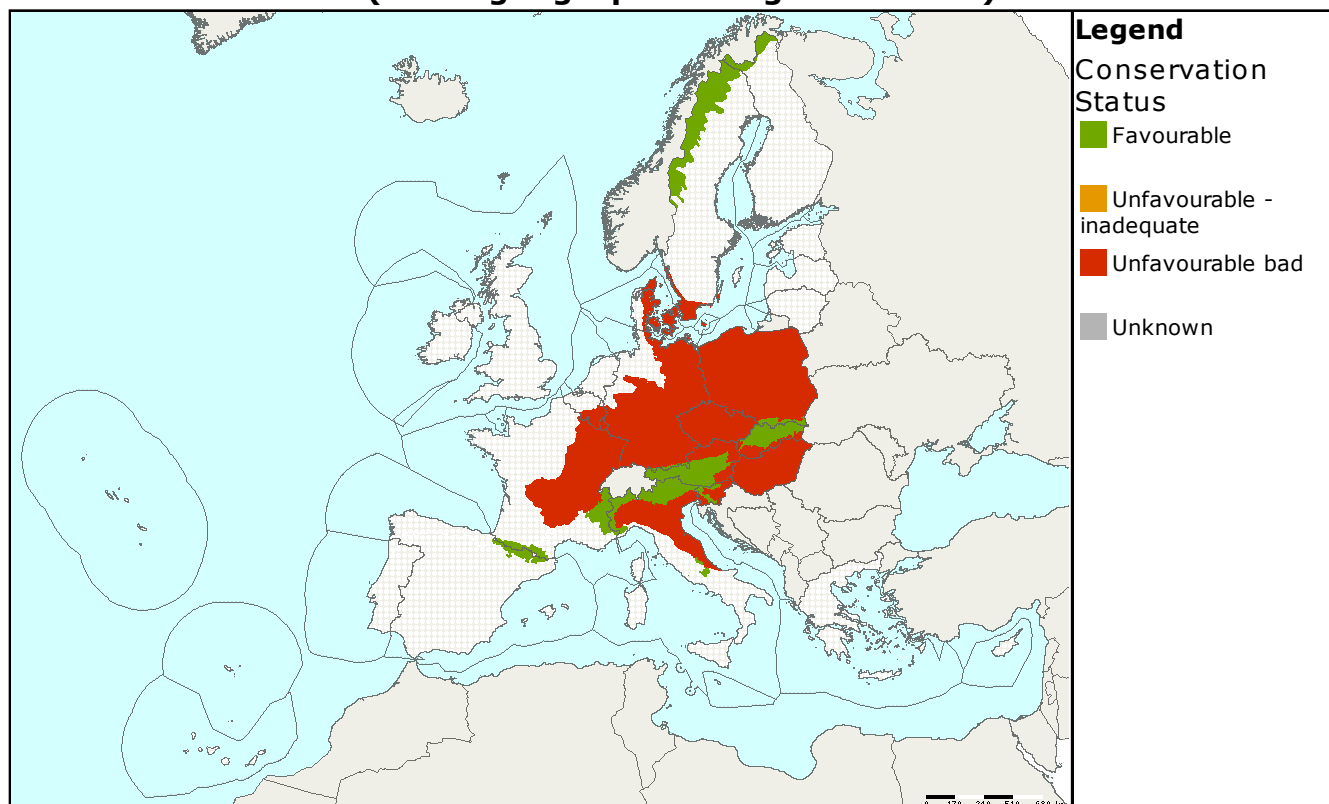

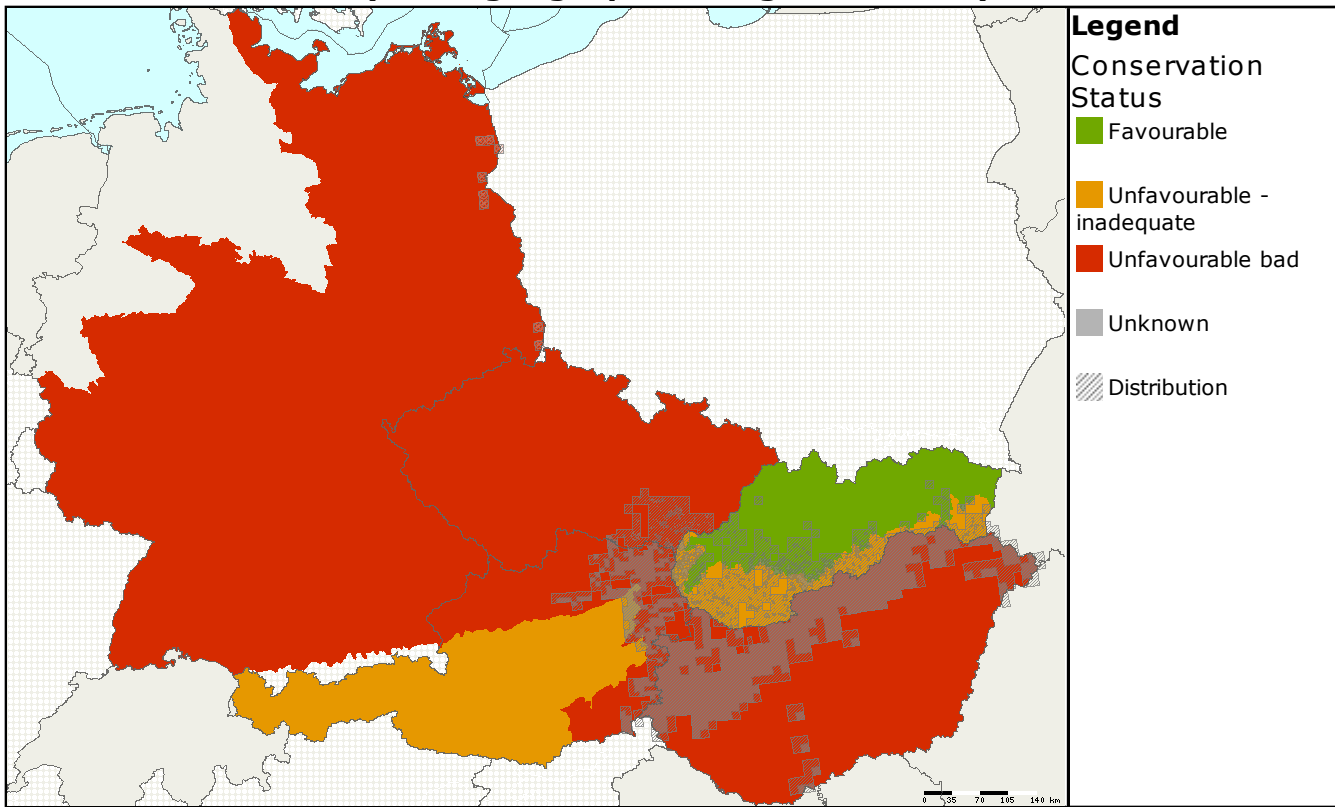

Mixed oak hornbeam (*Quercus petraea-Carpinus betulus*) forests of the plains and low hills of southeastern Central Europe. They mostly occur on humid, deep soils. The shrub and herb layers are dominated by sub-continental and sub-mediterranean plant species.

The conservation status in the Alpine region is 'unfavourable-inadequate' but 'unfavourable-bad' in the Continental and Pannonian region. Member State assessments are mostly 'unfavourable bad'. However the range and habitat area are in most cases stable and sufficient and assessment as 'unfavourable-bad' is connected to the status of structure and functions. Inappropriate forestry management represents the main pressure. This habitat is possibly present in Poland.
