



Oak or mixed oak-hornbeam (*Quercus* spp-*Carpinus betulus*) forests of Turkey oak (*Quercus cerris*), sessile oak (*Q. petraea*) or Hungarian oak (*Q. frainetto*) and related deciduous oaks including *Q. pedunculiflora* or *Q. virgiliana*. This habitat occurs in the hilly regions of the Pannonic basin, south and western Romania, the northern Balkans and the mountains of Greece and Anatolia.

The conservation status in the Alpine region, where the habitat occurs only in Slovakia is 'unfavourable-inadequate'. This is mainly due to the unfavourable status of the structure and function. In the Mediterranean region, where the habitat occurs only in Greece, the status is 'favourable' and no major threats were recorded. In the Pannonian region the status was assessed as 'unfavourable-bad' as the habitat area is decreasing and the structure and function are negatively affected by forestry management.
