



Forests of the sub-alpine and sometimes montane levels of the Alps and Carpathians, dominated by larch (*Larix decidua*) and/or Arolla pine (*Pinus cembra*). These two species may form either pure or mixed stands and may be associated with other conifers such as Norway spruce (*Picea abies*) or mountain pine (*Pinus uncinata*).

The habitat only occurs in the Alpine region. The conservation status was assessed as 'favourable' by all of the countries except France, however the biogeographical assessment is 'unfavourable-inadequate' because of poor future prospects in France.
