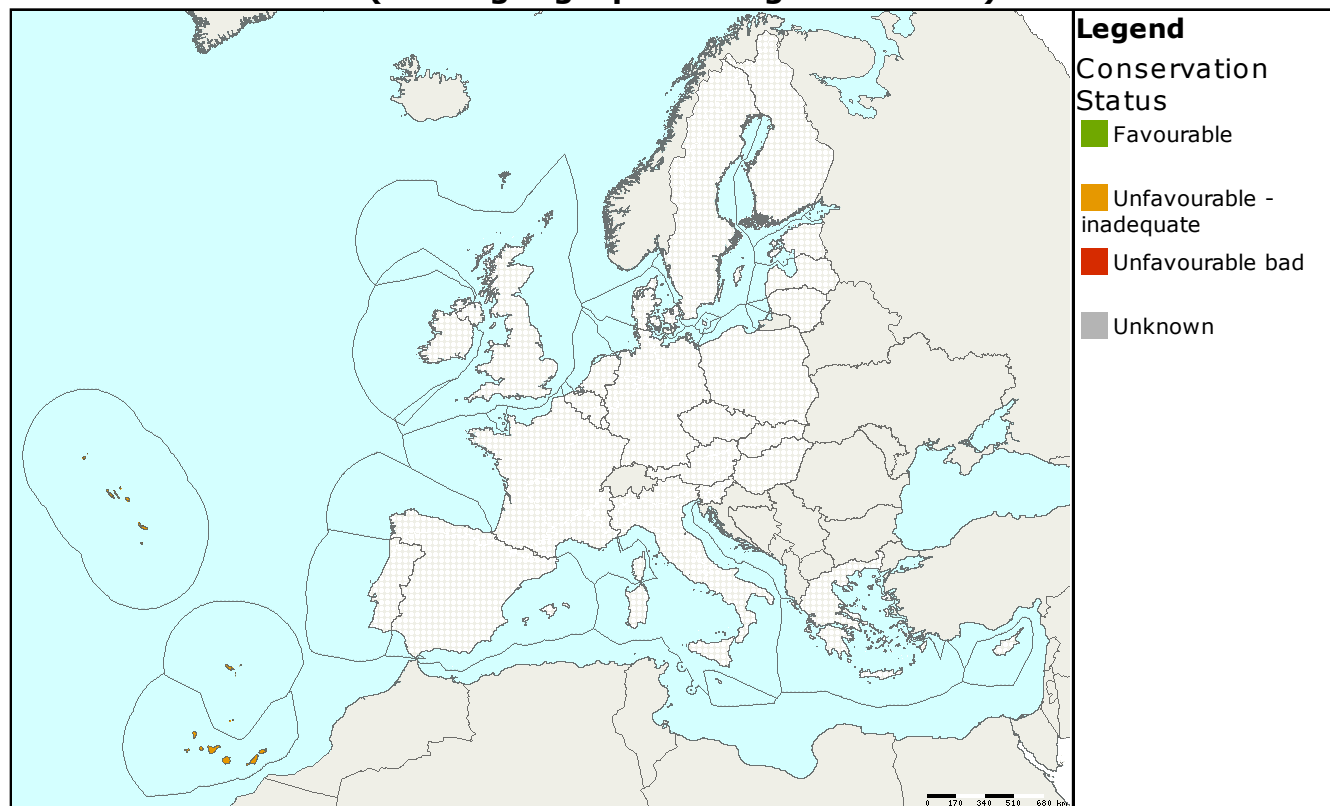

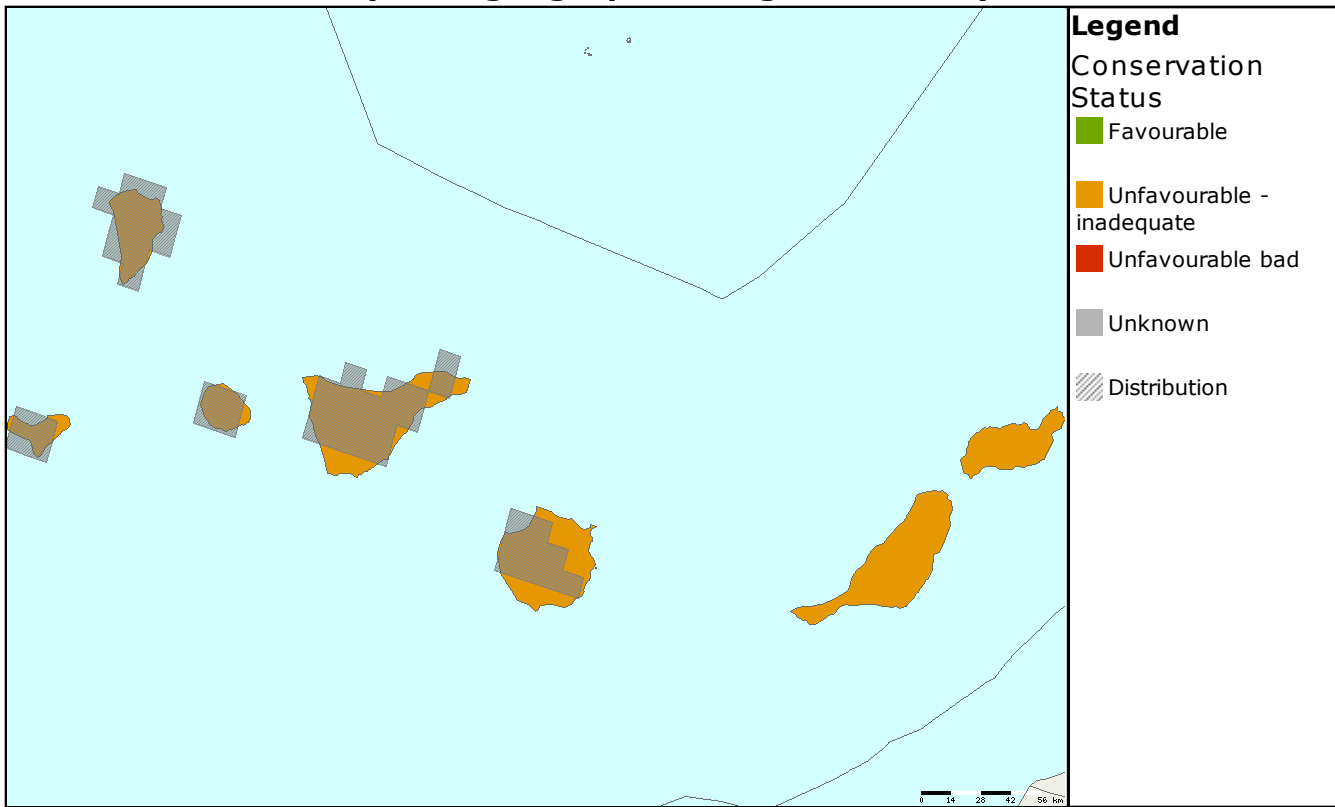

Forests of the endemic Canary Island Pine (*Pinus canariensis*) which are found on dry rocky slopes in the montane zone of the islands of Tenerife, La Palma, Gran Canaria and Hierro. The undergrowth is varied and these forests form the only habitat for the blue chaffinch (*Fringilla teydea*) and two subspecies of great spotted woodpecker (*Dendrocopos major canariensis* and *D. m. thanneri*) which are all included on Annex I of the EC Wild Birds Directive.

The conservations status is 'unfavourable-inadequate' with range and habitat area decreasing and structure and function reported as being 'unfavourable'.
