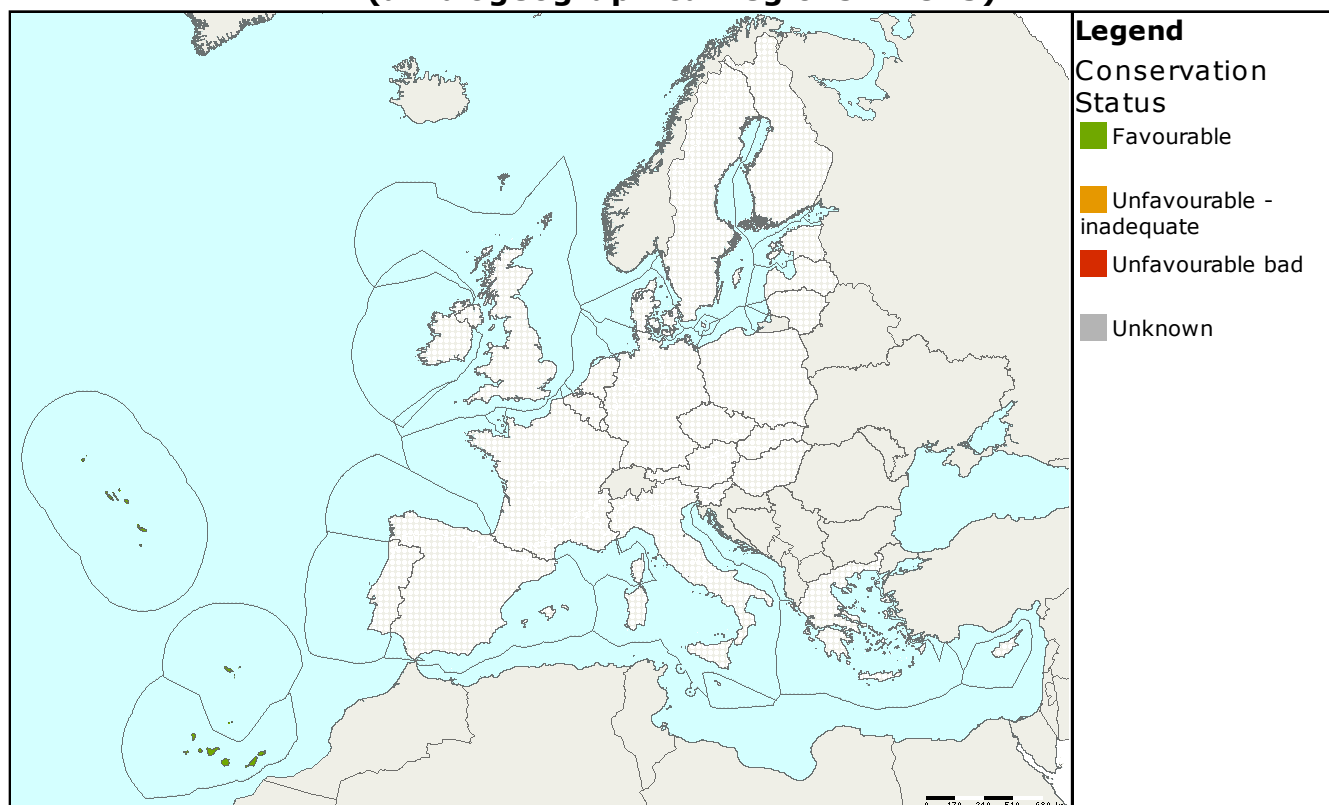

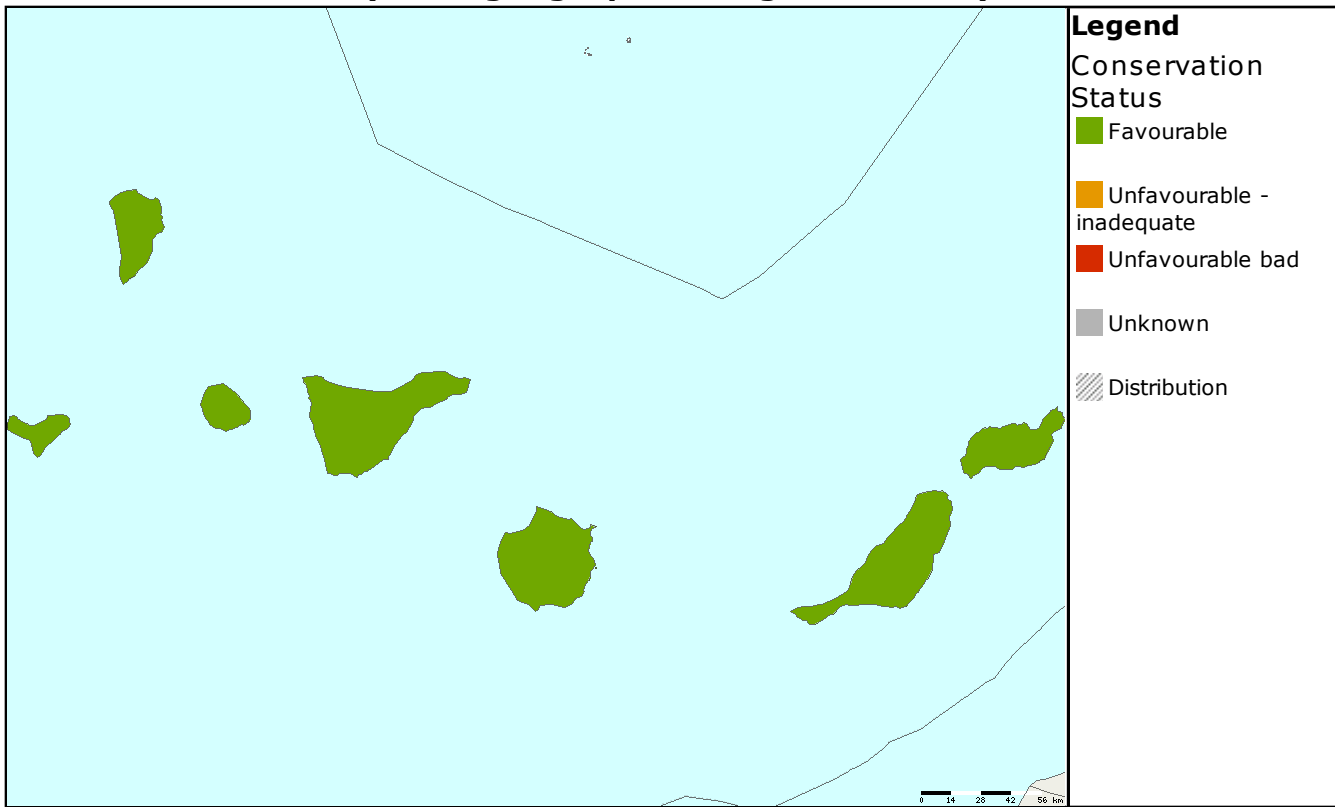

A lizard endemic to the islands of Tenerife, La Gomera and El Hierro in Canary Islands, Spain. It is relatively common and locally abundant within its natural range. It can be found in various types of natural, semi-natural and even secondary habitats, preferably in humid places.

The conservation status is 'favourable'. No major threats were recorded and the species is not considered particularly endangered in Spain.
