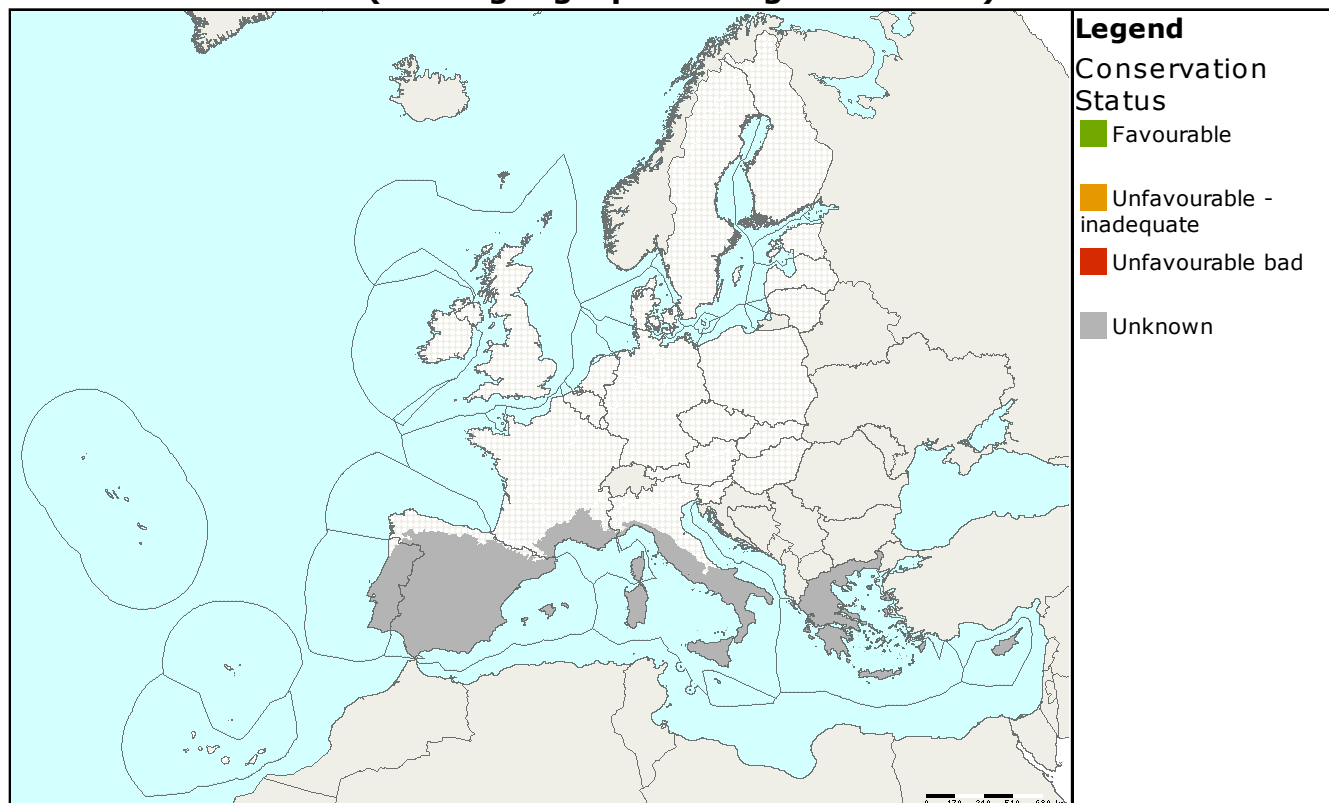

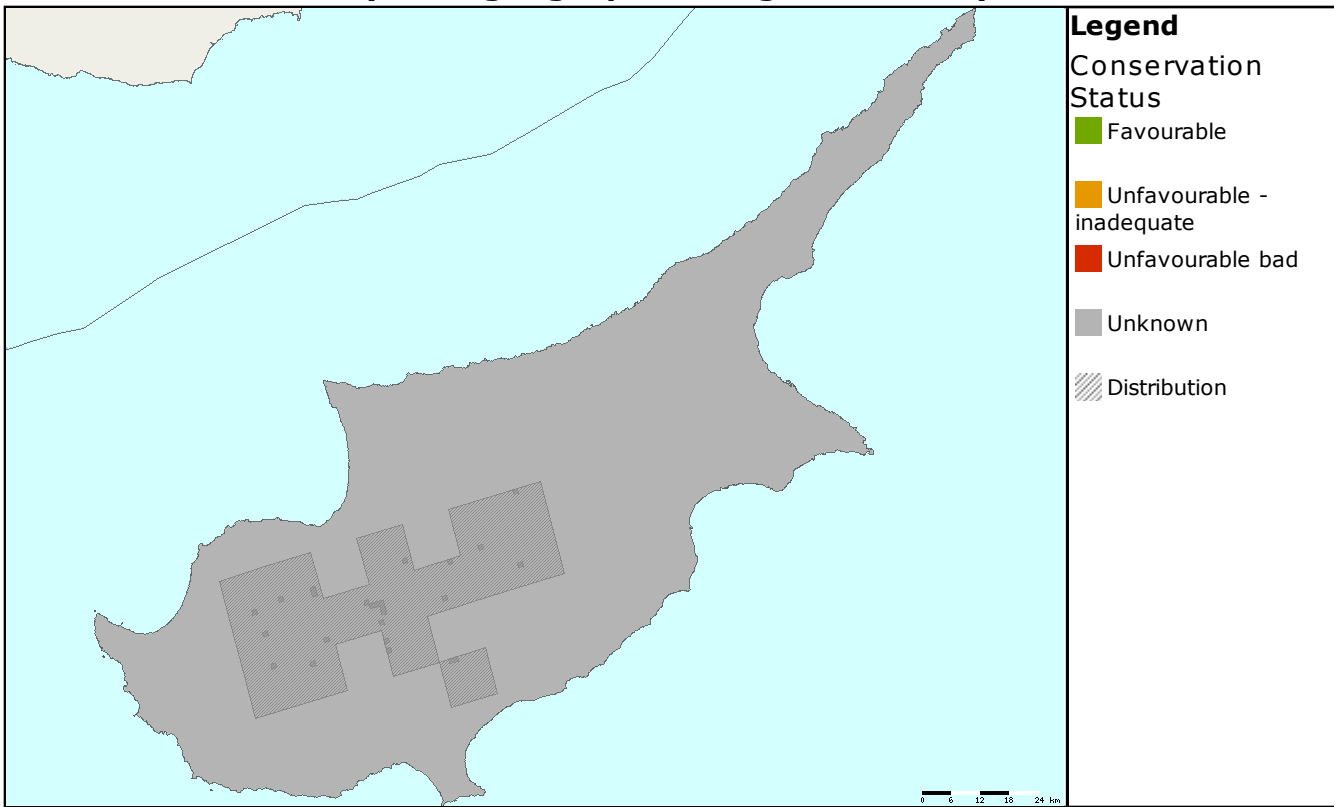

The Cyprus whip snake is endemic to the Troodos range in the western Cyprus where it inhabits forests and dense shrubs along water courses. It is mostly found on humid stands.

The conservation status is 'unknown'; the information on the status of the species and threats is not available or is scarce. However, according to the 2008 IUCN Red List this rare species with restricted range is on the decline and so it was evaluated as 'endangered'.
