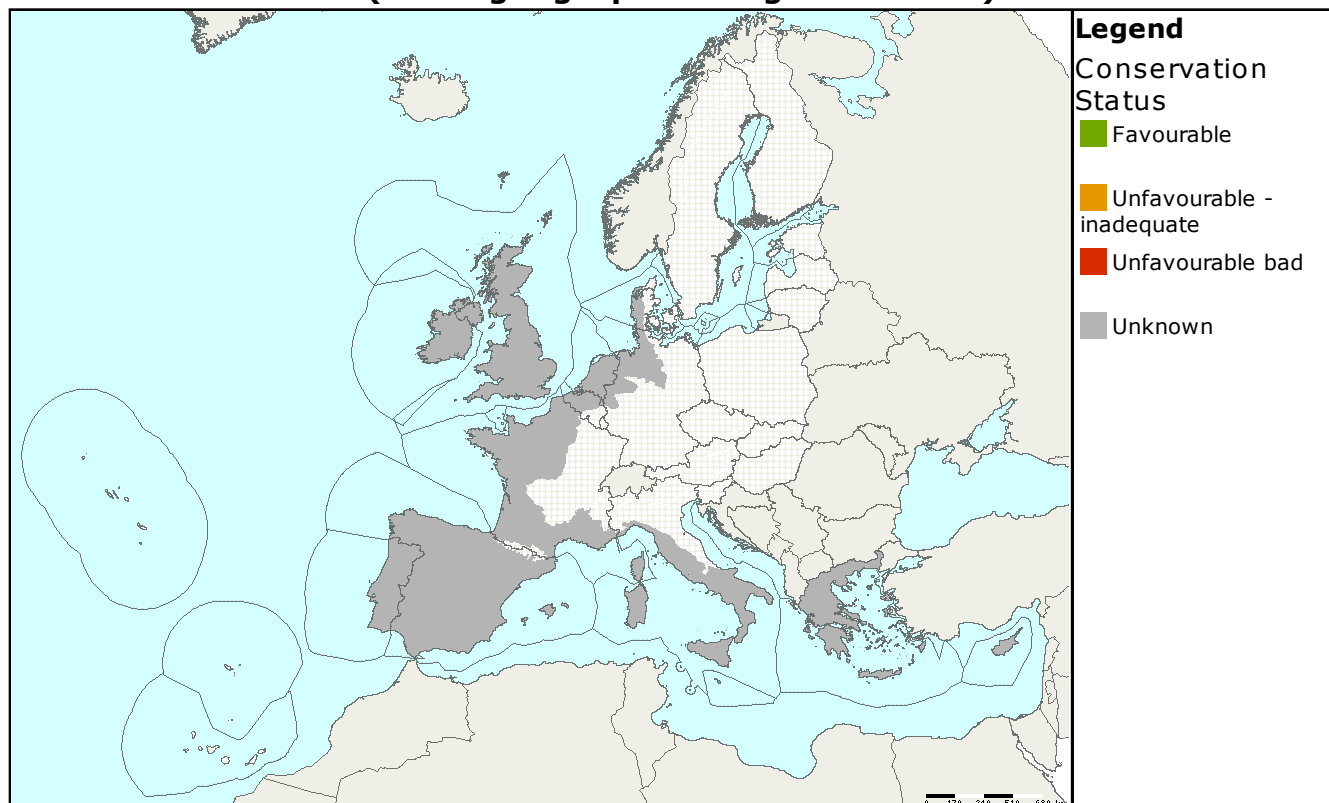

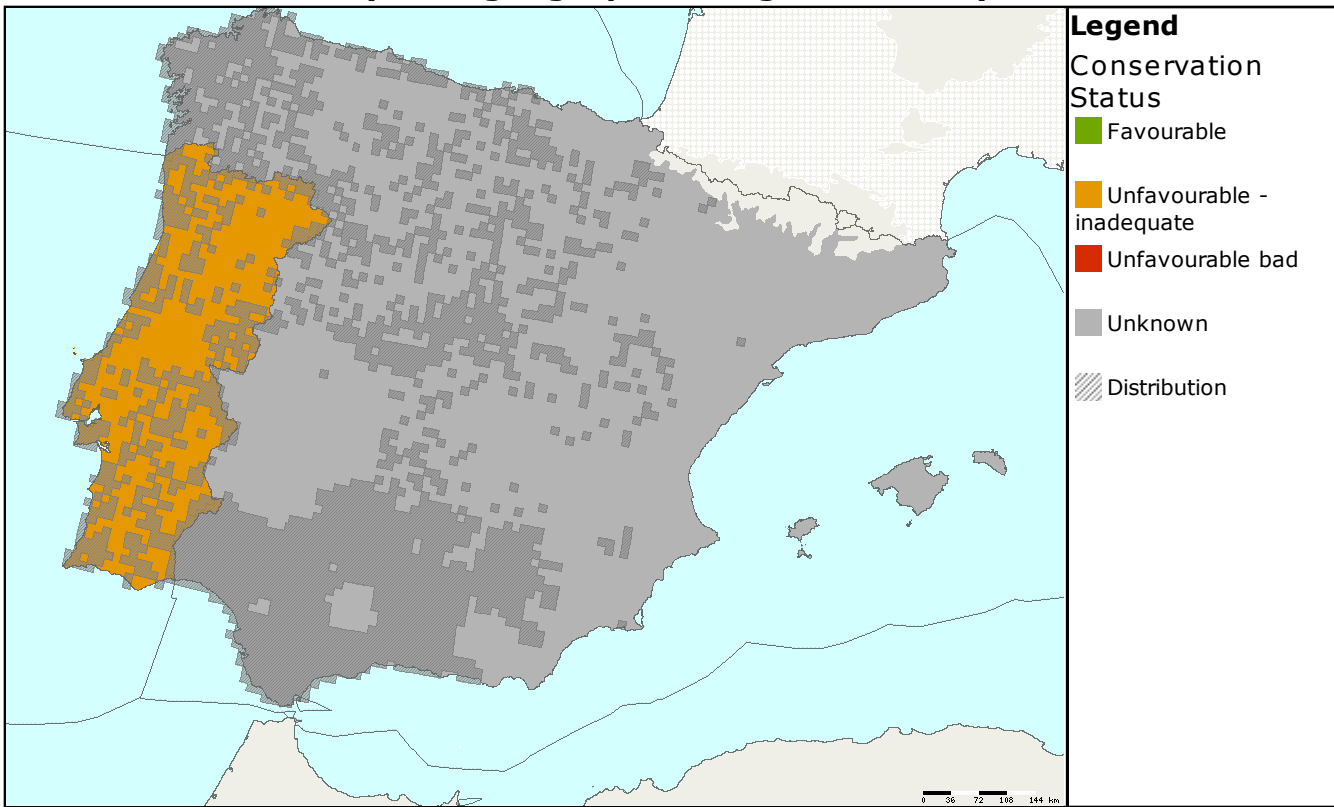

The Iberian painted frog is a species endemic to the Iberian Peninsula. It is relatively common across its natural range, perhaps except the north-western part. It occurs in various types of grasslands and herbaceous habitats in surrounding of small water bodies with still water.

The conservation status in both the Mediterranean and the Atlantic biogeographical regions is 'unknown'; the information about the actual parameters of conservations status is not available or is scarce. In Portugal the species is on decline. It is considered 'vulnerable' in this country. The main threats in both biogeographical regions are loss, fragmentation and degradation of the habitats connected to various anthropogenic activities.
