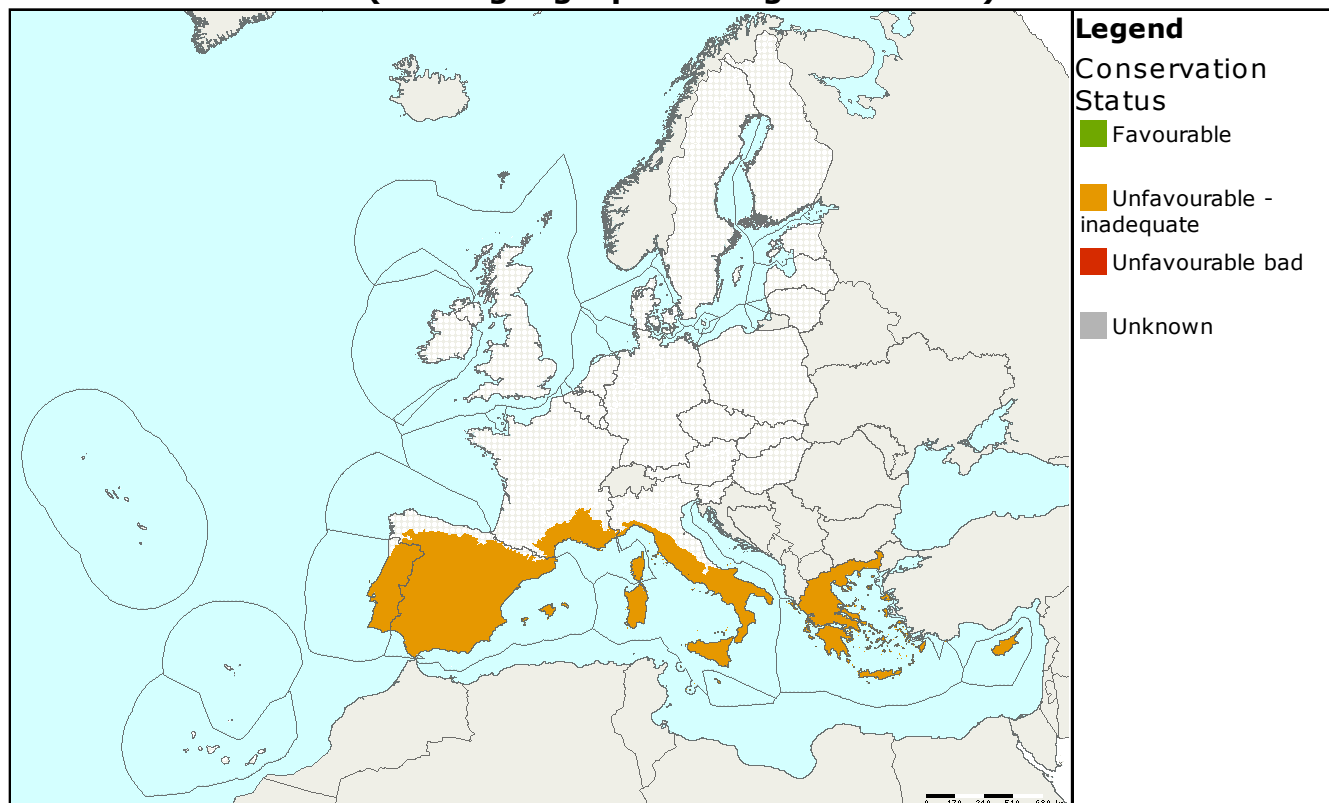

The ringheaded dwarf snake is a species occurring mainly in the south-western Asia, the localities on the eastern Greek islands represent the western margin of its natural distribution. It inhabits various types of habitats preferably on warm and dry stands with open vegetation.

It was assessed as 'unfavourable-inadequate' in the Mediterranean biogeographical region largely due to poor Future prospects. Other parameters are 'unknown'.
