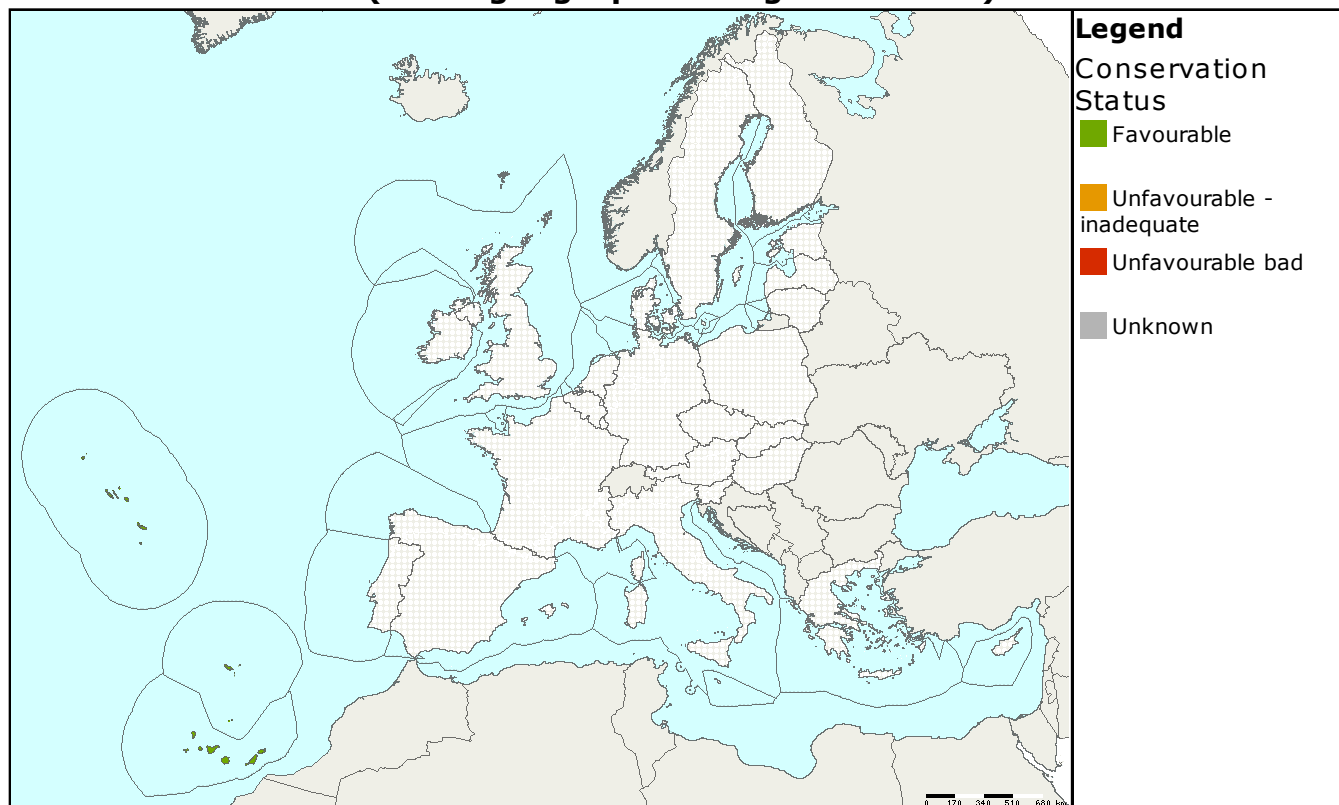

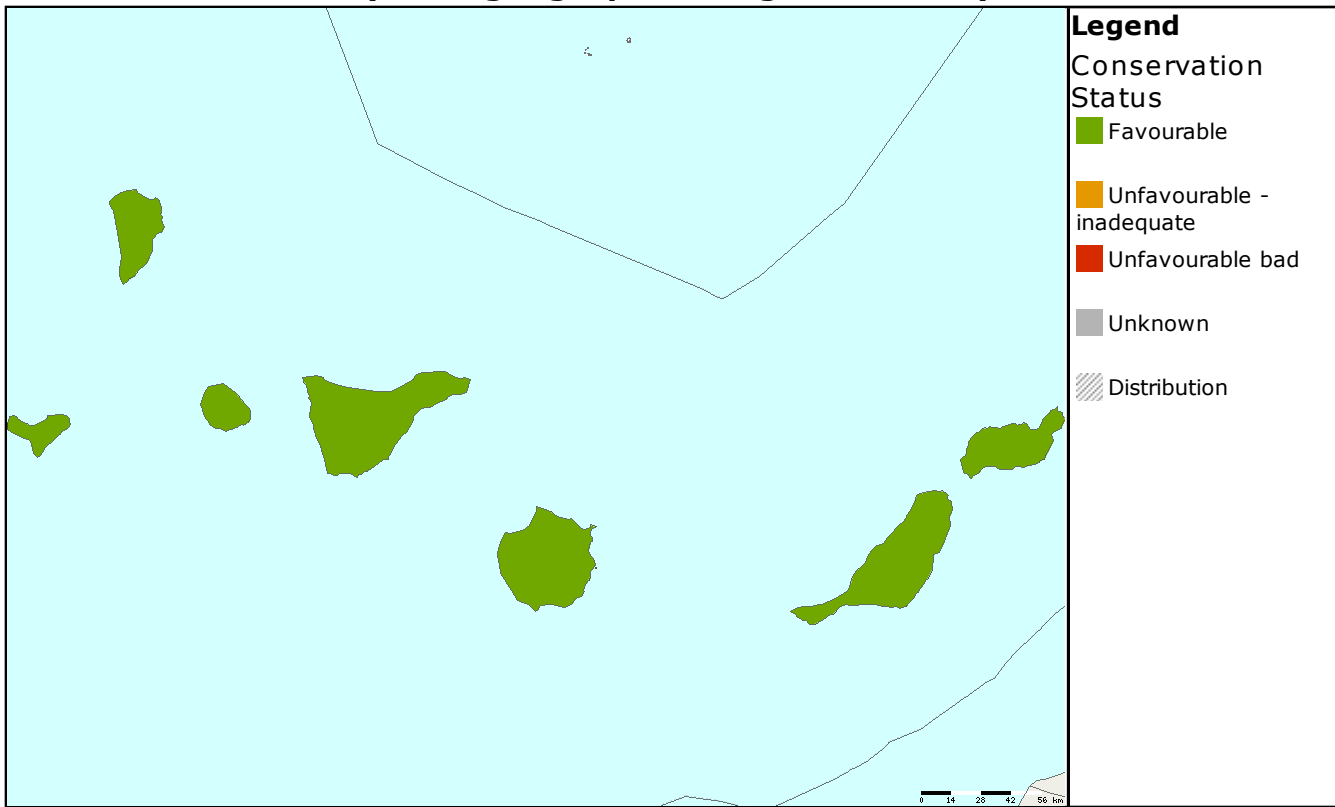

The Tenerife Lizard is endemic to Spain where it is native to Tenerife, La Palma, and the smaller surrounding islands. Introduced to El Hierro. It can be found in various natural, semi-natural habitats and man made habitats, preferably on warm and dry stands. The subspecies *G. g. insulanagae* is listed on both Annexes II and IV and is assessed separately.

It occurs only in the Macaronesian biogeographical region. Its conservation status is 'favourable'. The species is relatively common within its range and is not considered particularly endangered. Although the natural range is restricted, its populations are abundant and stable. It is listed in 2008 IUCN Red List as 'least concern'.
