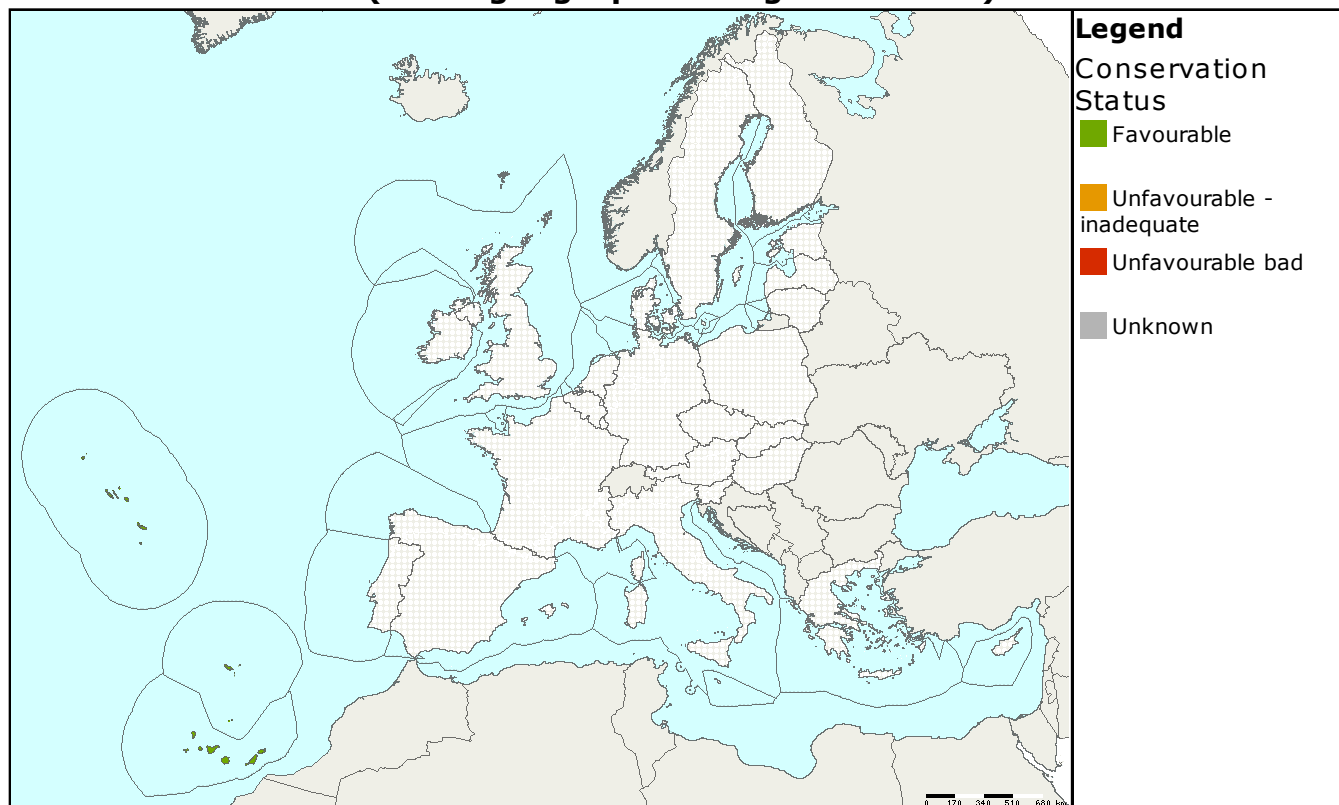

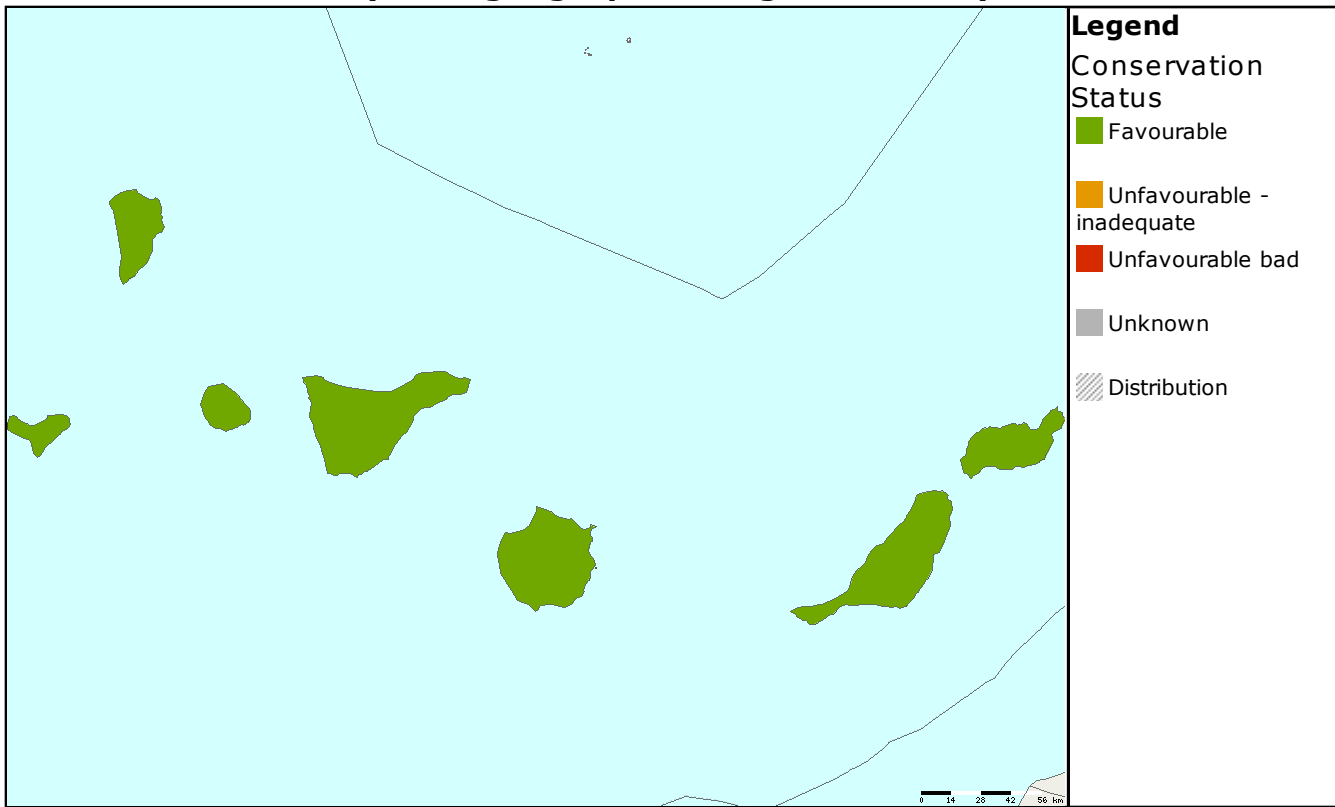

The Gran Canaria giant lizard is endemic to the island of Gran Canaria, Canary Islands, Spain. It has also been introduced to island of Fuerteventura. This species is present in a wide range of habitats, excluding perhaps only forested areas.

It occurs only in the Macaronesian biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'favourable'. The species is relatively common within its range and is not considered particularly endangered. Although the natural range is restricted, its populations are abundant and stable. It is listed in 2008 IUCN Red List as 'least concern'.
