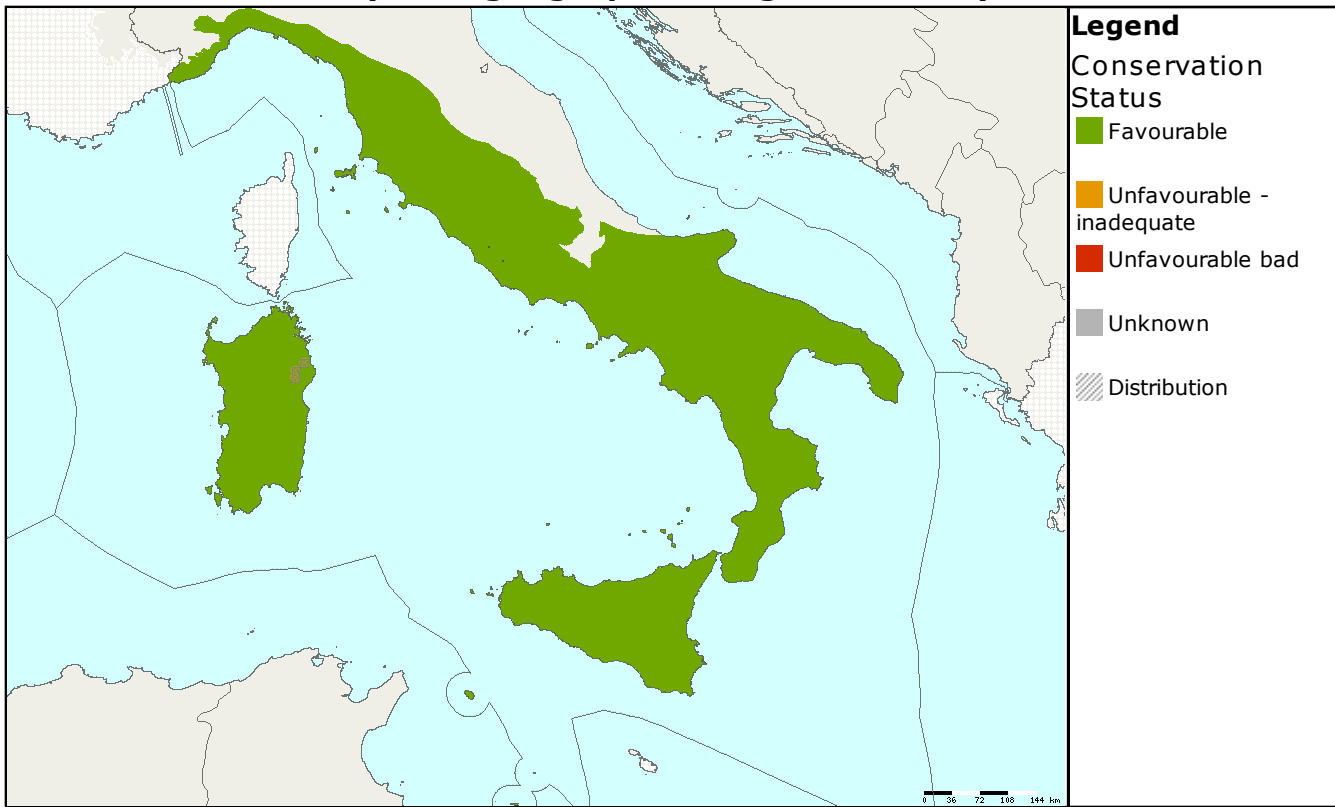

The Monte Albo cave salamander is a north-eastern Sardinian endemic. It occurs in the mountain of Monte Albo and hilly areas in its north-western periphery. The species is found in humid and shaded habitats like caves but also the walls of deep wet canyons and humid forests.

It occurs only in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'favourable'; population and range are stable. No major threats are known. However the species is included in the 2008 IUCN Red List as 'vulnerable', mainly because of its very restricted distribution.
