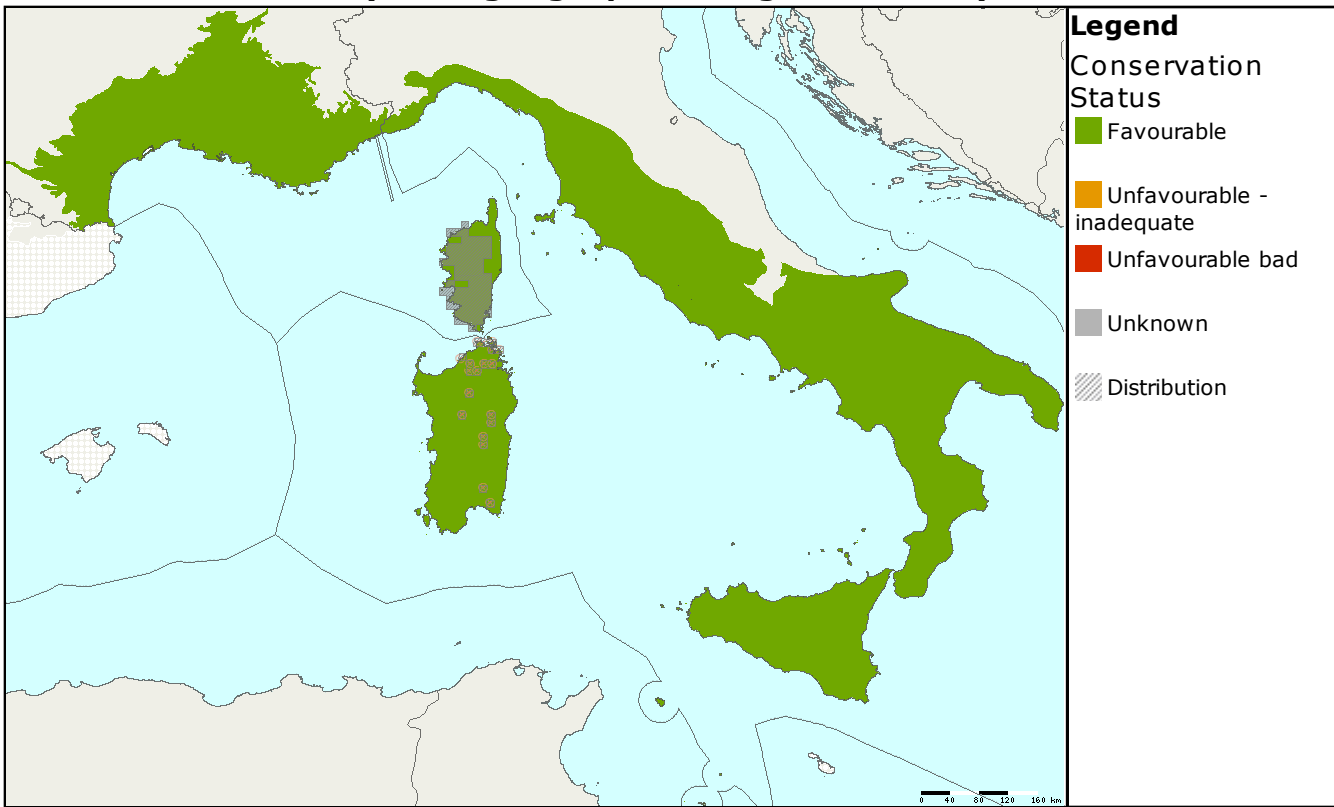

The Bedriaga's rock lizard occurs in montane areas on the island of Corsica (France) and on most of the mountain groups of Sardinia (Italy). It is found in both rocky areas and in open woodland and scrubland. It often occurs in semi-shaded areas close to streams. In spite of the fact that the range of this species is only on two islands, the overall assessment is 'favourable'. However, according to IUCN Red List the species is considered as 'vulnerable' due to the declining population and the declining extent and quality of its forest habitat.
