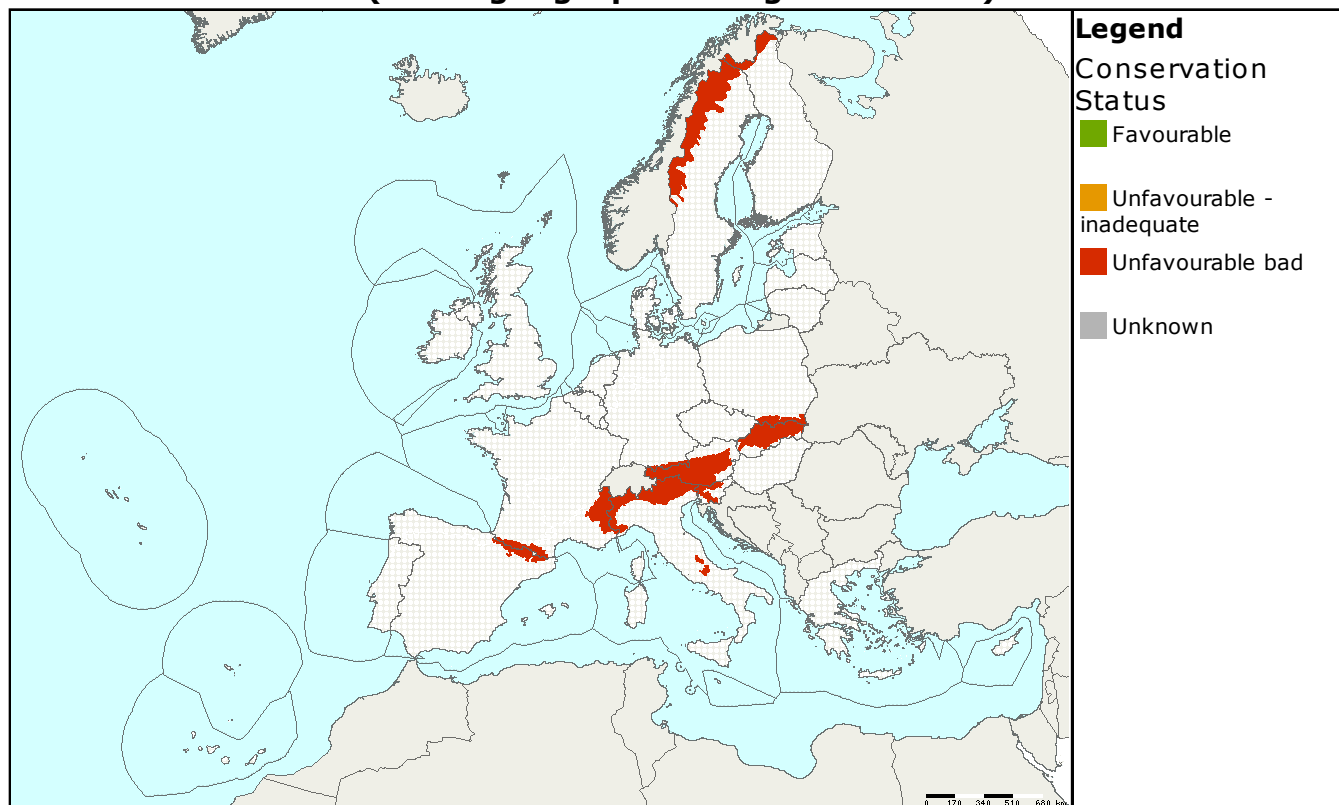

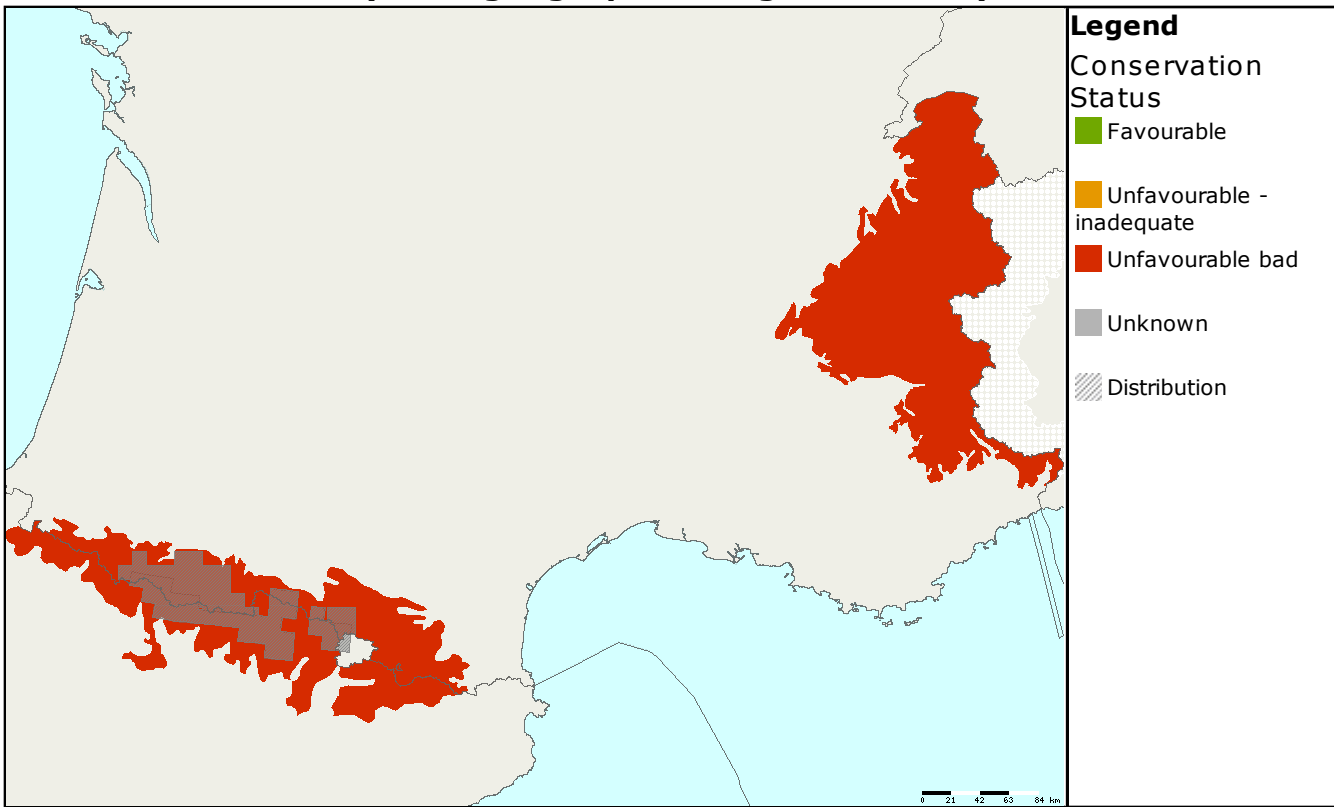

The Pyrenean rock lizard is present in the central Pyrenees Mountains of France and Spain (Alpine biogeographic region). The overall assessment for this species is 'unfavourable-bad', same as both French and Spanish conclusions. The assessment for the Spanish report should be 'unfavourable - inadequate' but it would not change the overall assessment. According to IUCN the species is considered to be 'near threatened'.
