



The European leaf-toed gecko is a species that occurs in the Mediterranean region in Corsica (France) and Sardinia (Italy) together with nearby regions in mainland in Italy and France. This species is generally found in rocky areas, such as cliffs, boulders and stone walls in agricultural land. The species overall status of conservation is "unfavourable-bad" because of the negative assessment for habitat and future prospects parameters reported by Italy. All individual parameters are reported as "favourable" by France. The species is listed as "Near Threatened" by IUCN because its extent of occurrence is probably less than 20,000 km².
