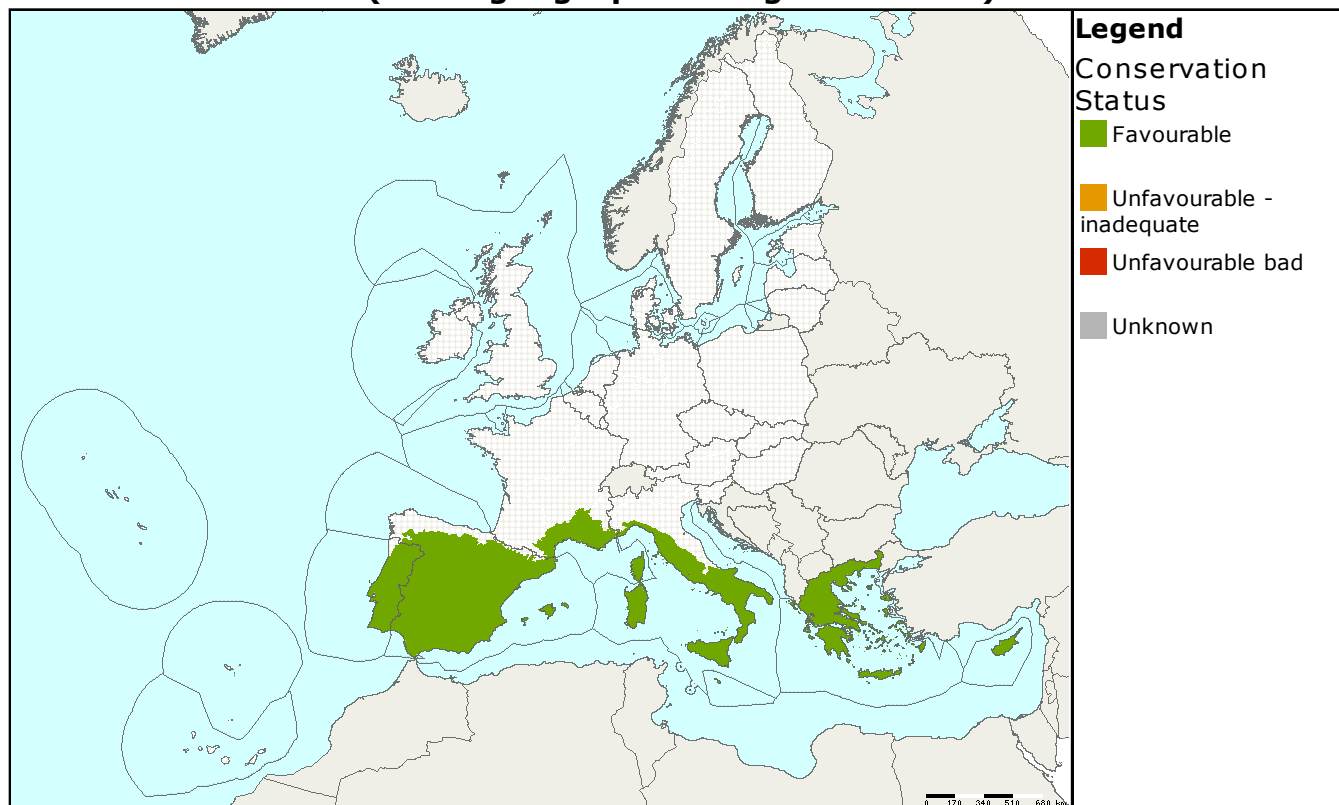

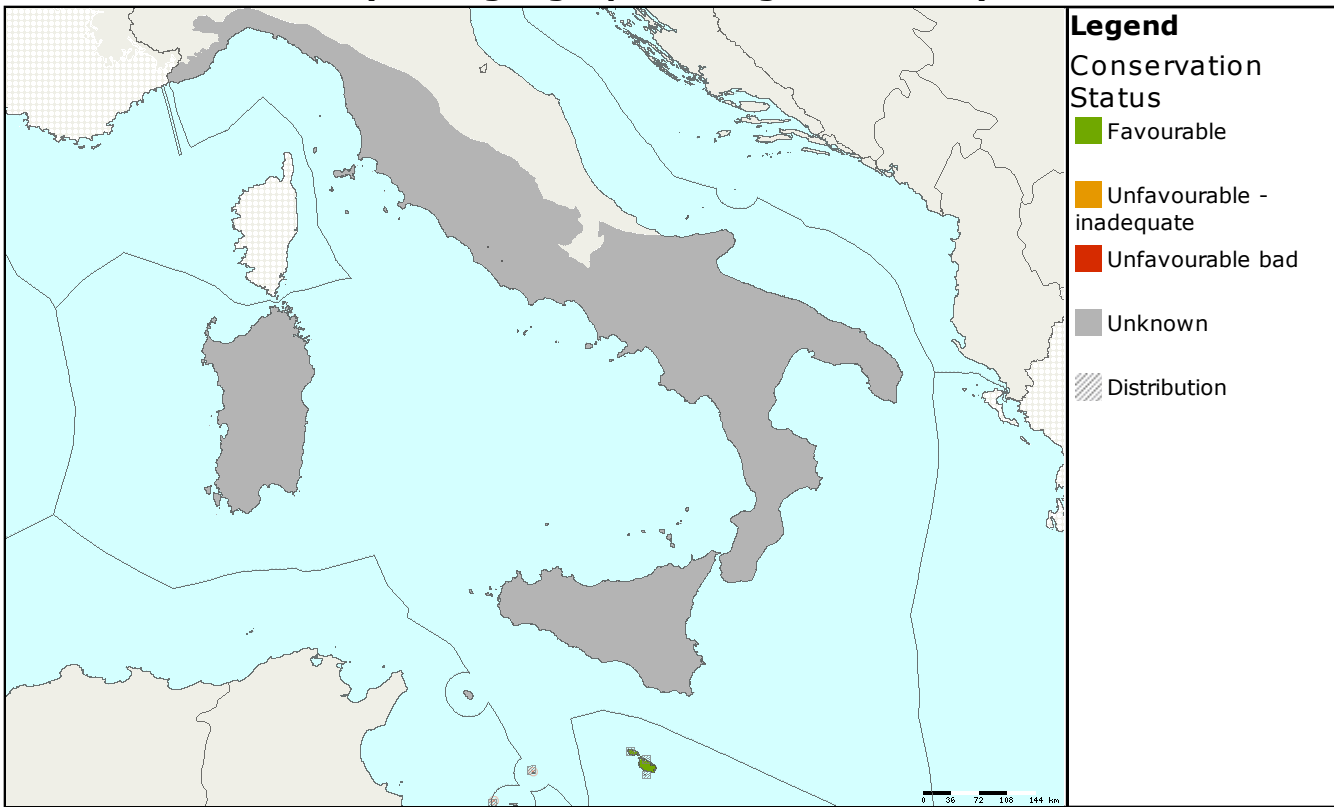

The Maltese wall lizard is native to Malta and some Italian islands. It is found in dry habitats including scrubland, rocky areas, traditionally cultivated land and gardens. There are five infraspecific taxa for *Podarcis filfolensis* known in Malta and the country made reports for each taxa. The results of most of them are 'favourable' and the overall assessment is also 'favourable'. In Italy species is assessed as 'unknown'. According to IUCN the species is considered as 'least concern'.
