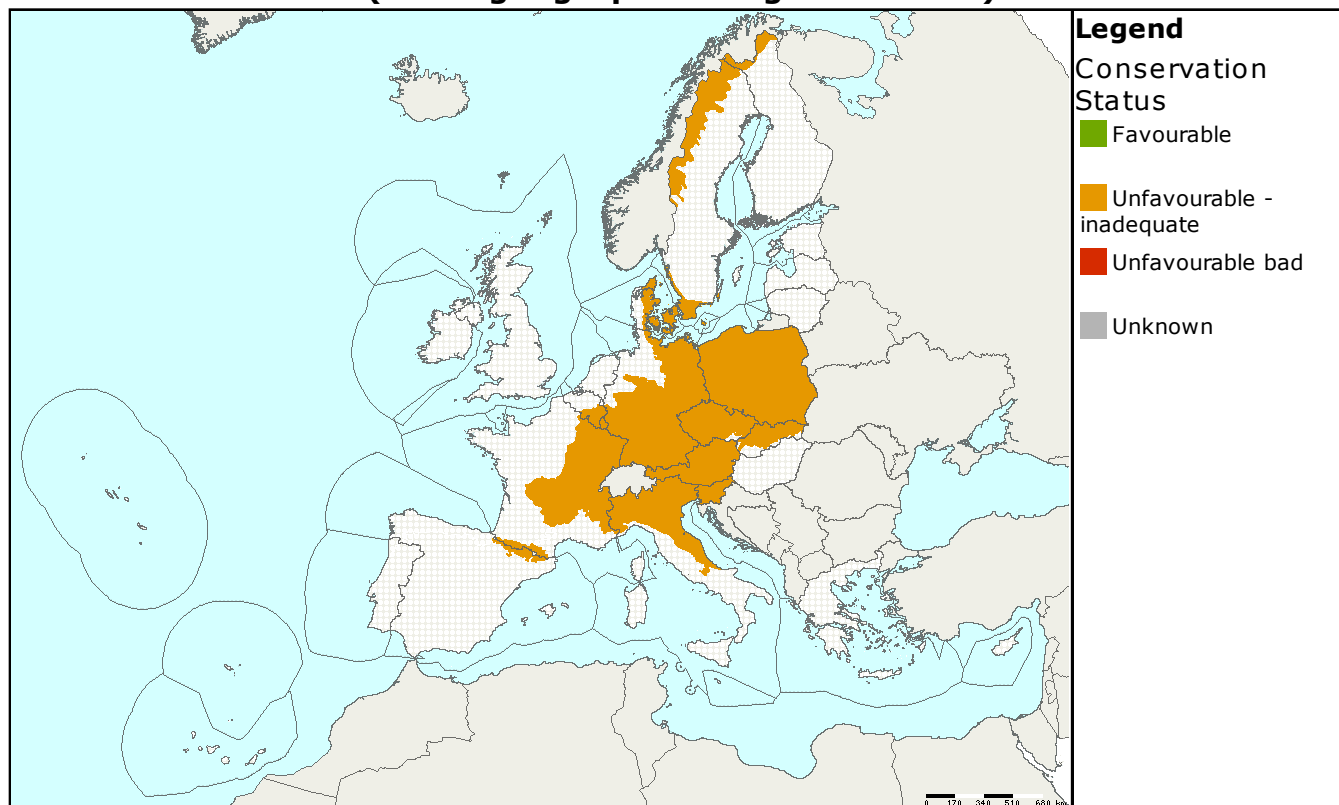

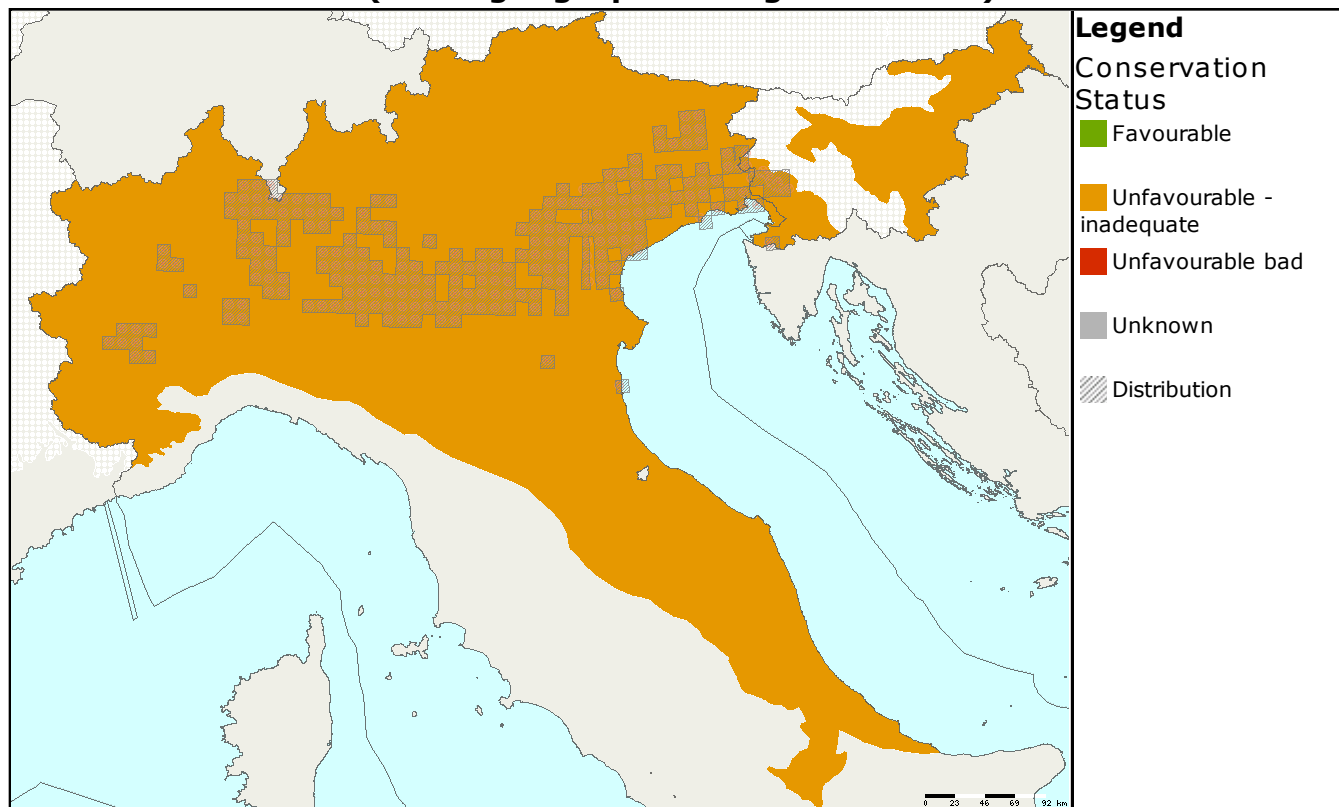

The centre of the distribution of the Italian agile frog is Padano Venetian plain in the northern Italy. The natural range extends towards the south to the lowland areas along the Adriatic Sea in Slovenia and Croatia. This frog inhabits various types of lowland wetland habitats like marshes, swamps, fens or flooded areas along water courses.

The conservation status in both the Alpine and the Continental biogeographical region is 'unfavourable inadequate'. The natural range of the species is restricted. Its habitats, mainly alluvial forests are being destroyed due to various types of human activities, which cause the decline of the population in certain areas and the isolation of the remaining populations. The species is included in the 2008 IUCN Red List in the category 'vulnerable'.
