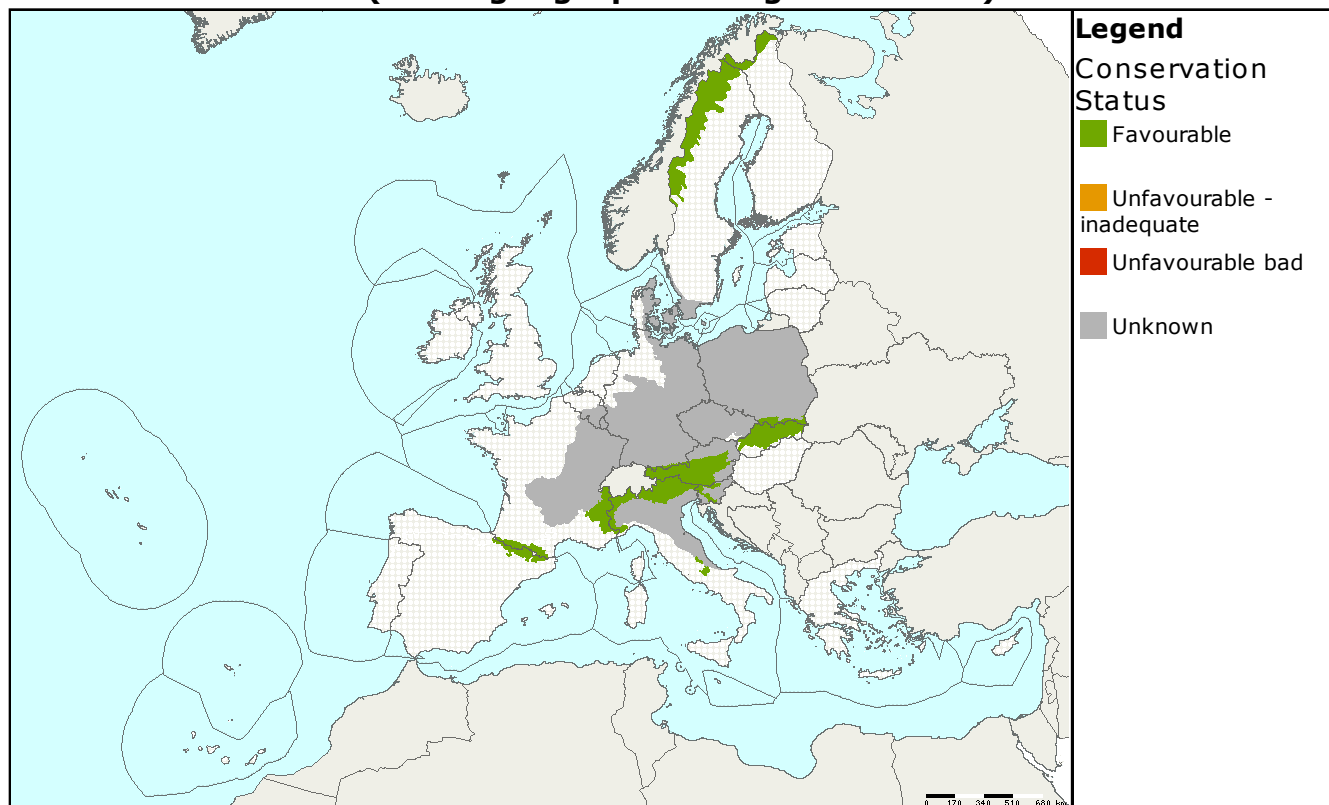

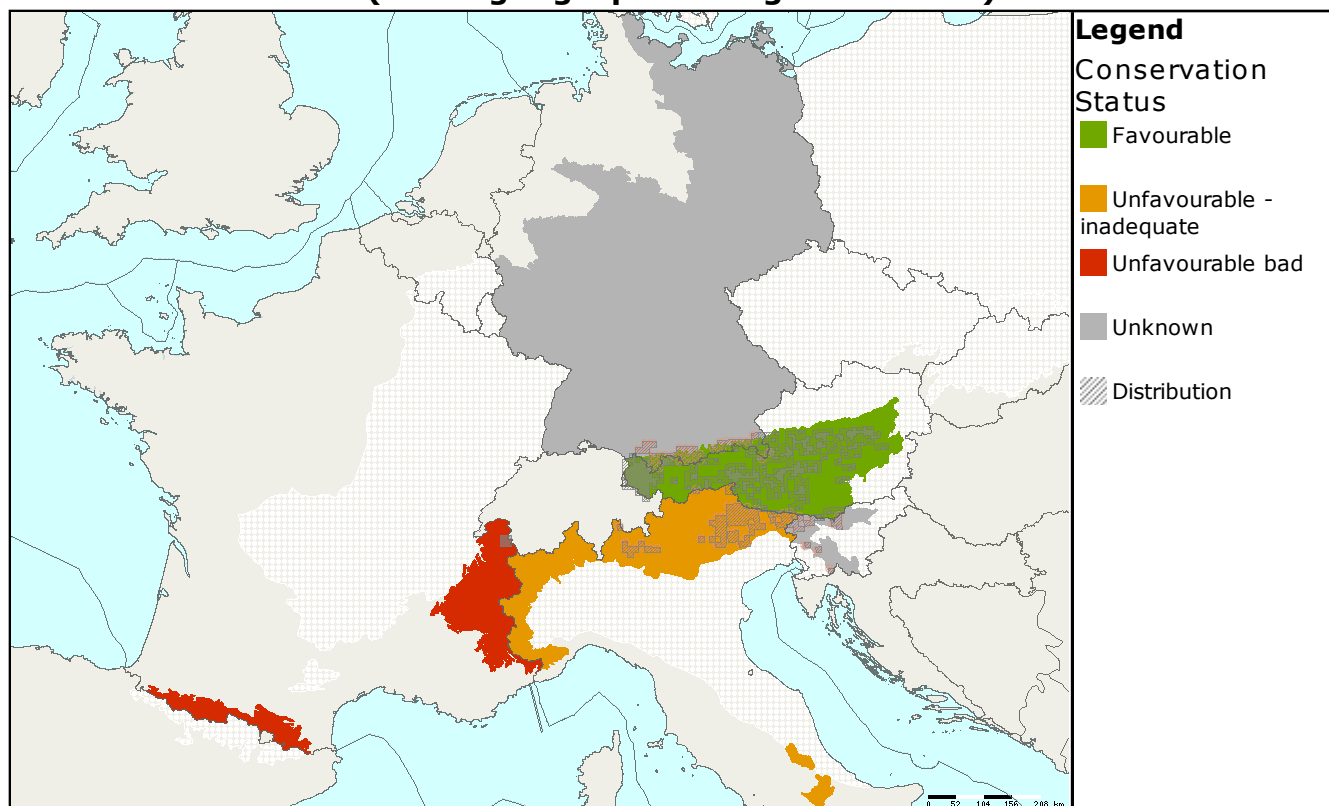

The alpine salamander is present in the European Alps with isolated populations in the Balkan Dinaric Alps. It is found in cool, damp alpine meadows, stony pastures, dwarf heath and mixed, broadleaf and coniferous woodland. Its status of conservation is assessed as "favourable" in the Alpine region despite the individual parameters reported as "unfavourable-bad" by France. The overall assessment for Continental region is "unknown", with data only reported by Germany. The species is listed as "Least Concern" by IUCN in view of its wide distribution, tolerance of a degree of habitat modification.
