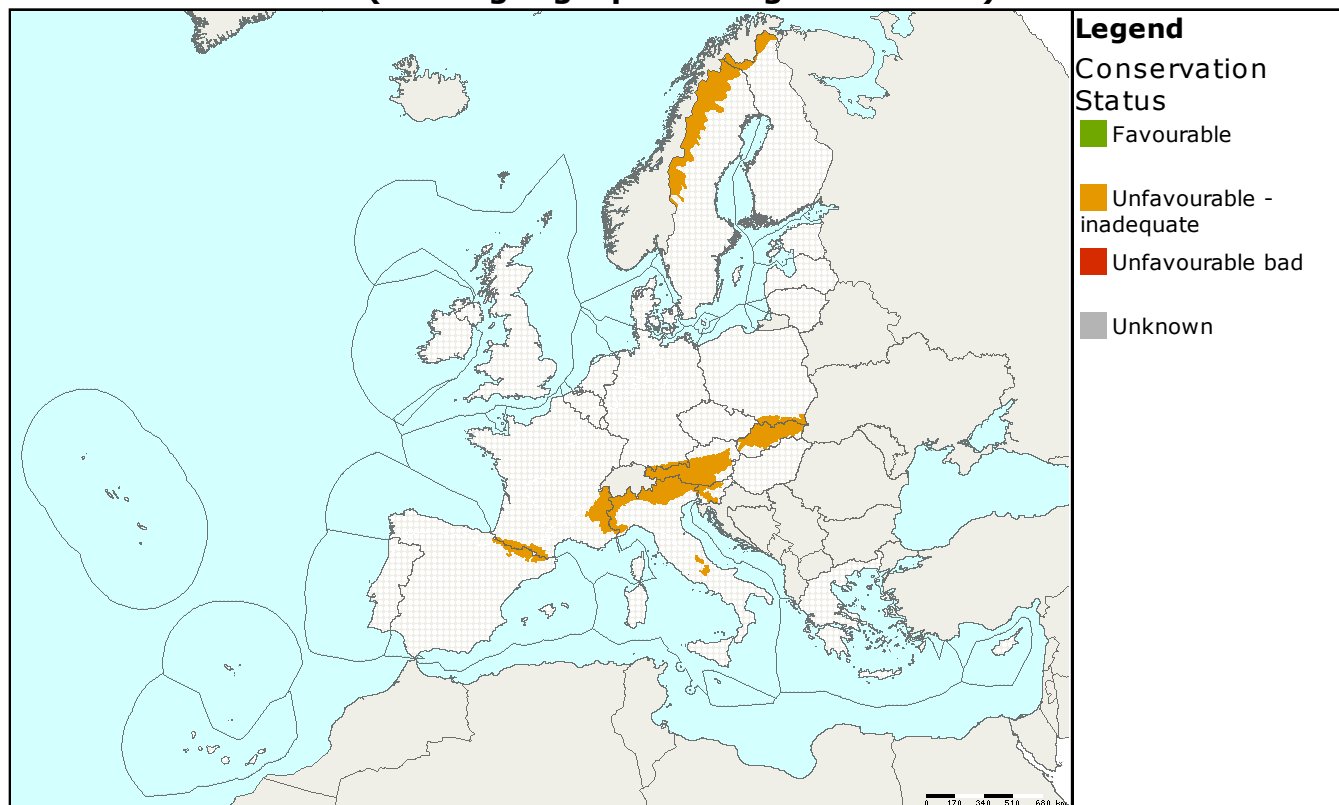

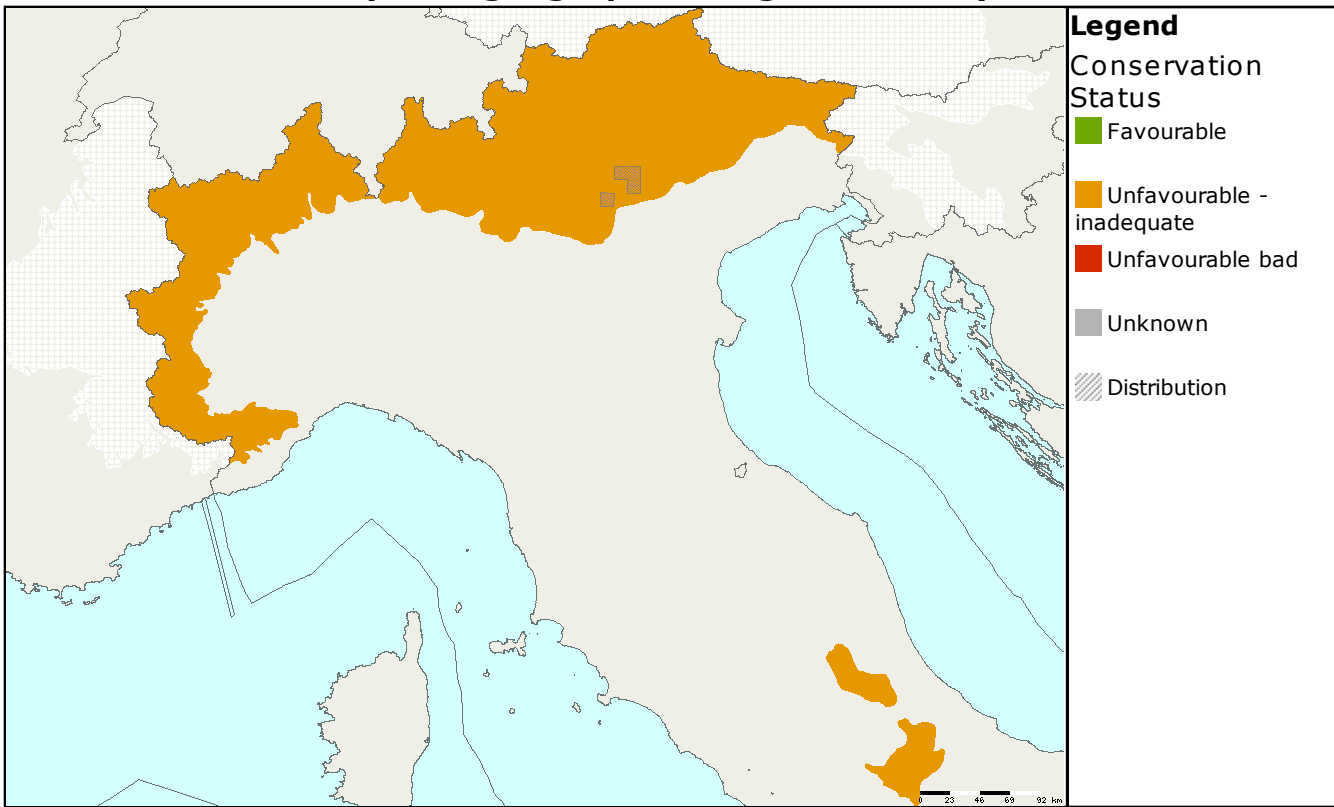

The Golden Salamander is a subspecies of the Alpine Salamander endemic to the narrow area between Trento and Asiago in the Italian Alps. It occurs in mixed mostly beech-fir forests with rich undergrowth occurring on the places with high humidity.

The conservation status of this narrow endemics is 'unfavourable inadequate'. The range and the population size are lower than favourable and the population size is decreasing.
