



The south European toothcarp is distributed in all countries of the Mediterranean region to the exception of the Iberic Peninsula. It is restricted to coastal waters including islands. In the Mediterranean region, the status of conservation is assessed as "unfavourable-inadequate" despite some individual parameters are reported as "favourable" by Greece and Malta. For the Continental and Marine Mediterranean region, the overall assessment is unknown". In general, better information is required for the species. It is assessed as "Least Concern" by IUCN.
