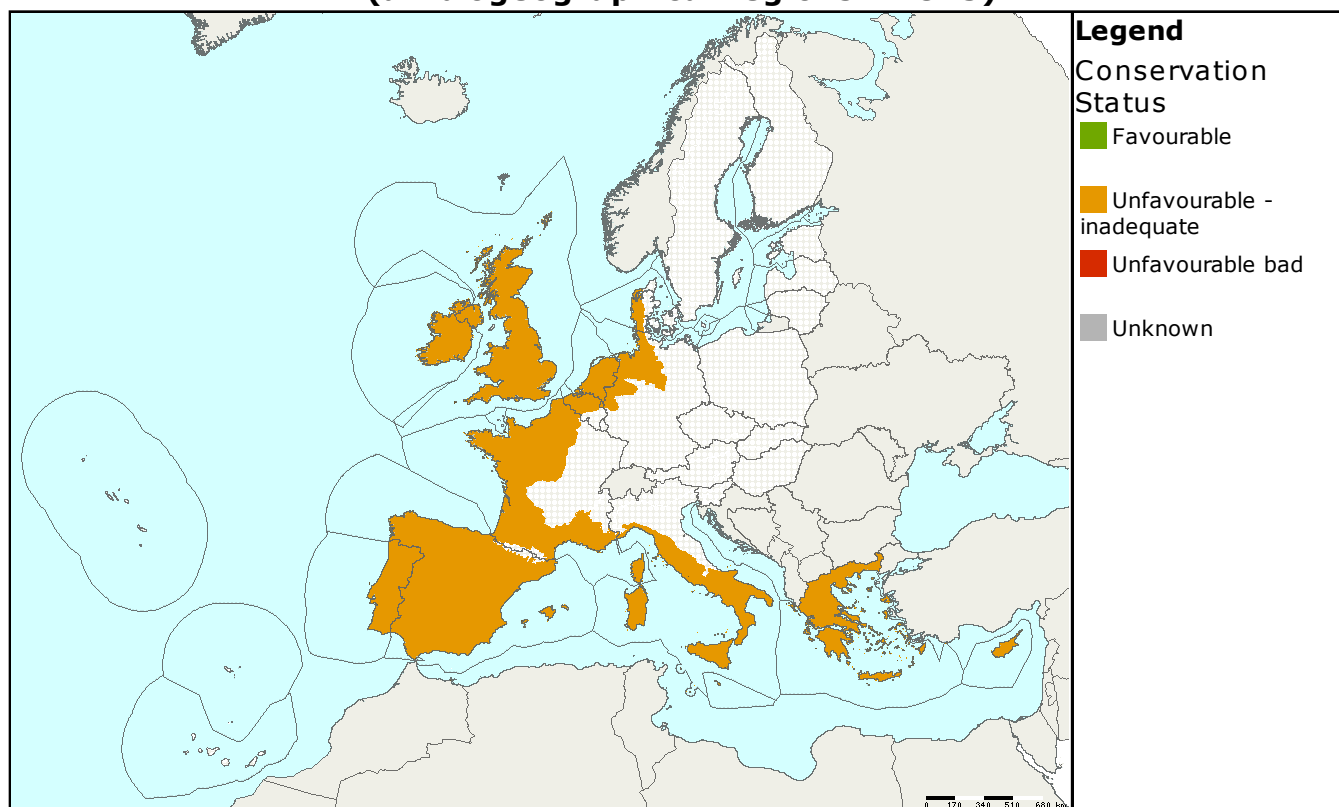

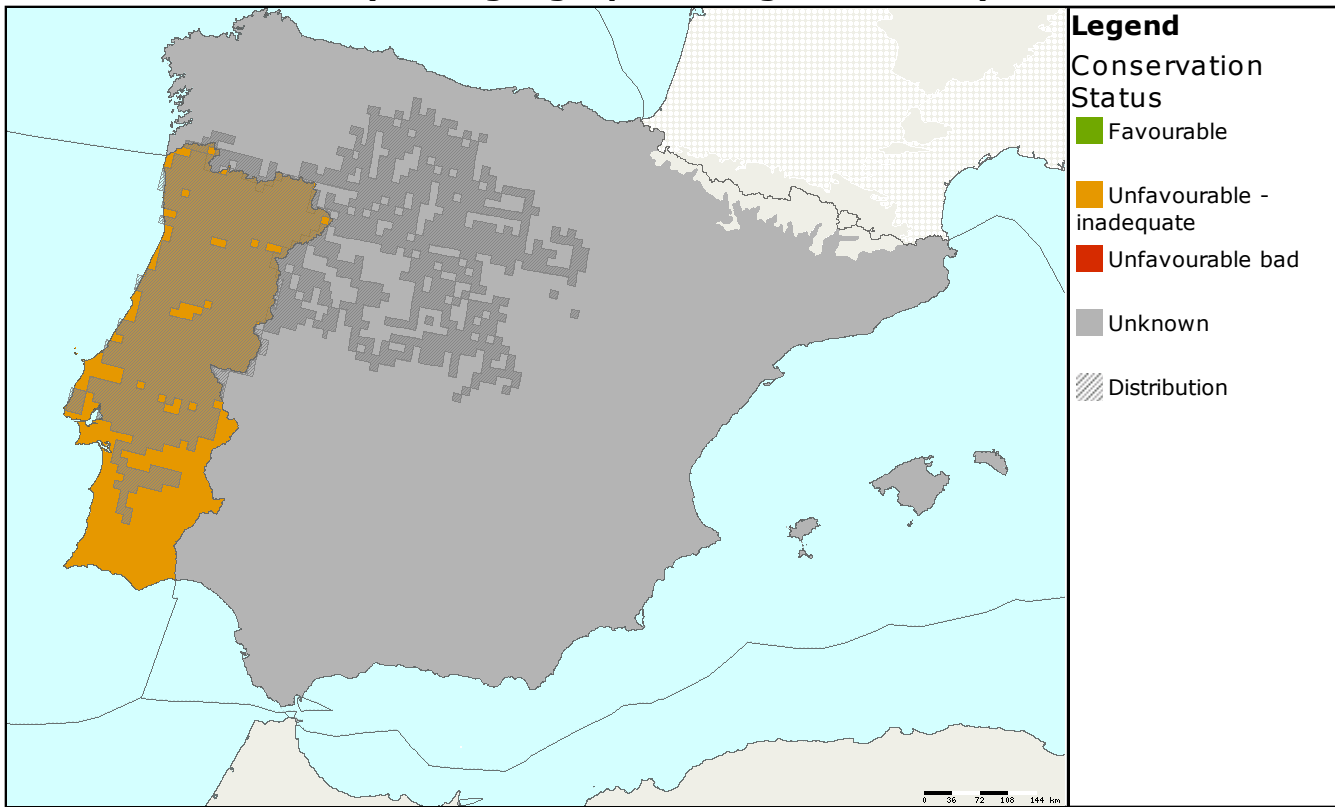

A fresh water fish endemic to the Iberian Peninsula. It inhabits lower and middle sections of bigger rivers, mainly areas with slowly flowing water. It is often found in reservoirs.

The conservation status in both the Atlantic and the Mediterranean biogeographical regions is 'unfavourable inadequate'. Although the species is considered relatively common and populations are abundant it is on decline in both countries. In the 2008 IUCN Red List it is evaluated as 'least concern'. The habitat of the species is negatively affected by various human activities like changes of a water level, water pollution and gravel extraction.
