



This report refers to B.c.waleckii (valid name Barbus peloponnesius) a freshwater fish species, which was previously considered endemic to Peloponnesus and western Greece. Recently it was recorded in Vistula and Dniester river systems in Poland and Ukraine. It can be found in fast flowing cold upper sections of rivers and in oligotrophic lakes.

This fish species was reported only by Poland, the Greek report is missing. The conservation status in the Alpine biogeographical region is 'unfavourable bad' and in the Continental biogeographical region 'unfavourable inadequate'. In both biogeographical regions the range, the population size and as well the area of habitat are decreasing. In Greece this species is relatively abundant, no major threats are known.
