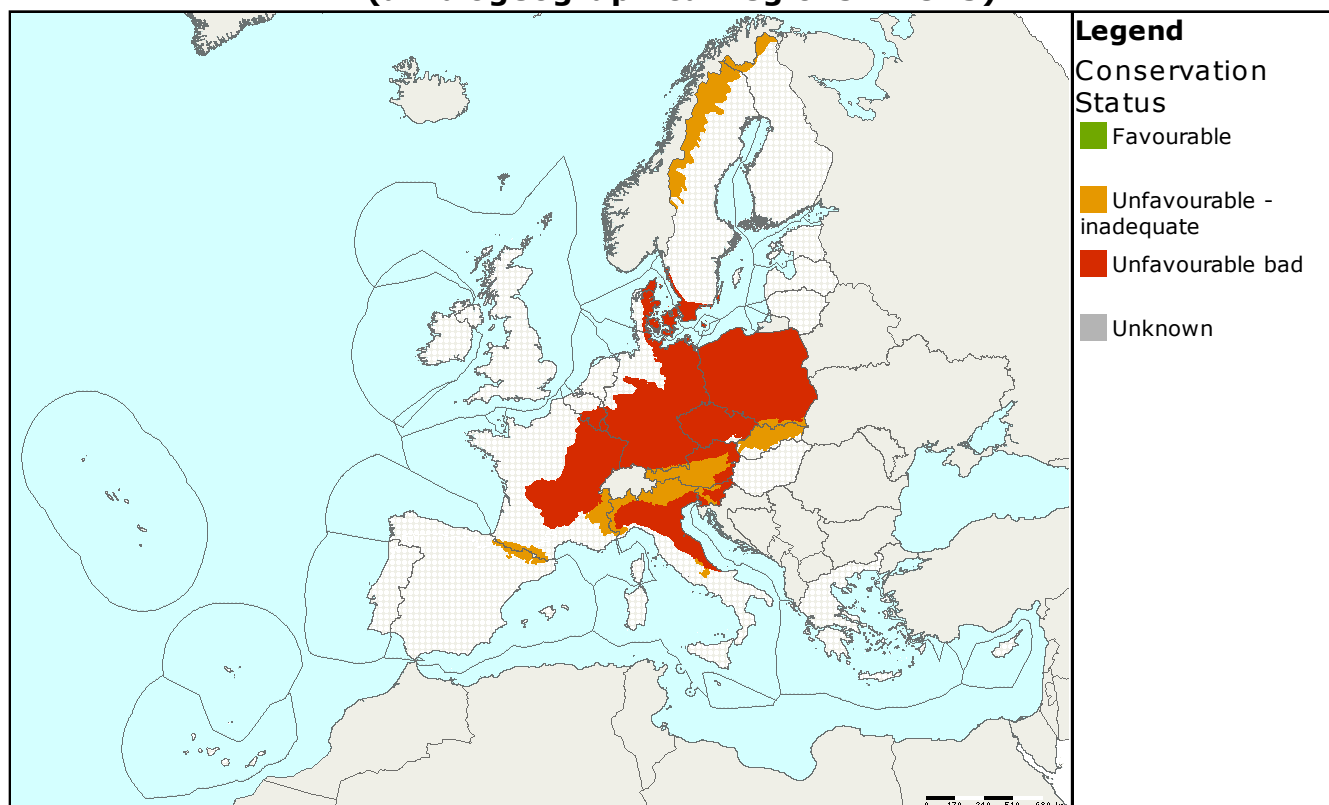

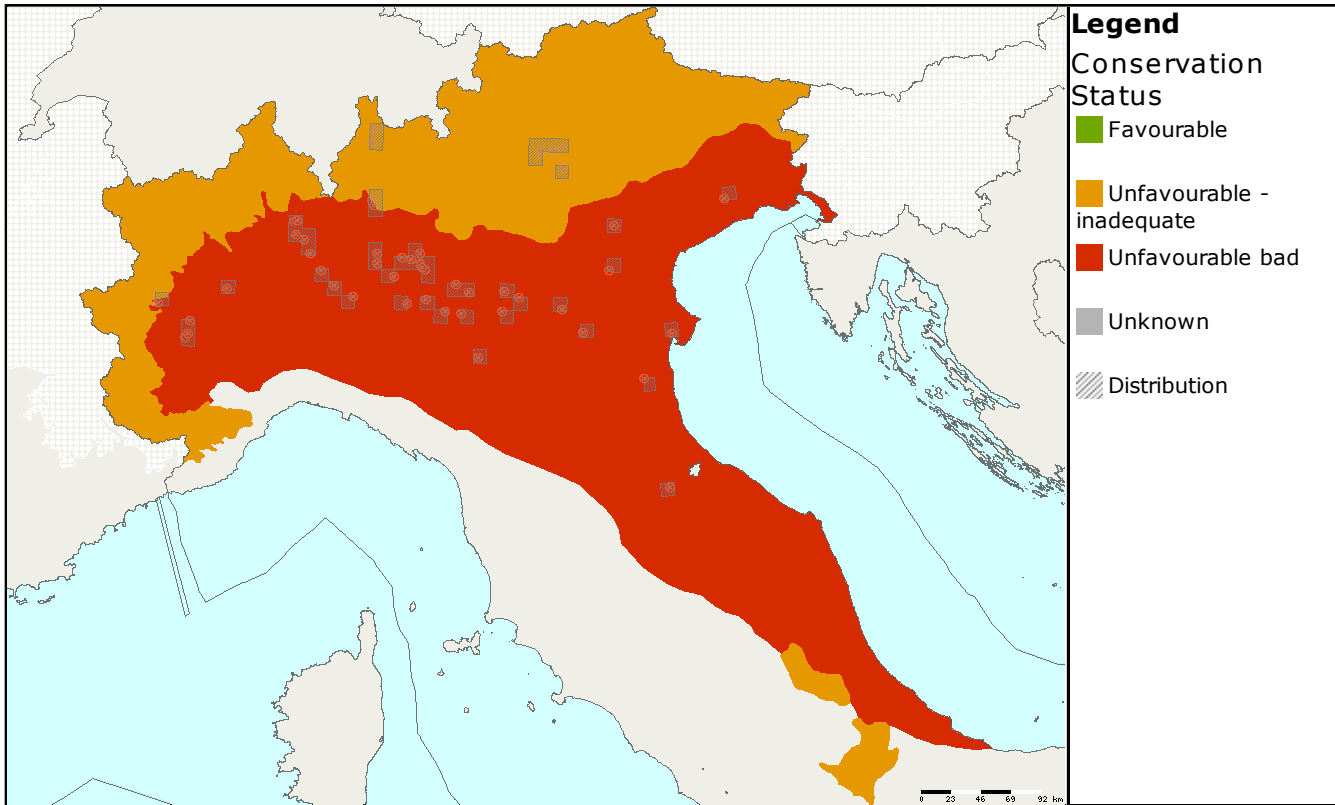

The Italian Nose is a fish species endemic to the northern Italy and adjacent parts of Switzerland and Slovenia. In Slovenia it is considered extinct. It occurs mainly in deep waters of the lakes, occasionally it can be found in large rivers.

The conservation status in the Alpine biogeographical region is 'unfavourable inadequate', in the Continental 'unfavourable bad'. The population size is decreasing mainly due to the negative interactions with introduced species. Also dams (the species migrates to upper parts of rivers to spawn) and water pollution are negatively influencing the conservation status. It is evaluated as 'endangered' in the 2008 IUCN Red List.
