



The *Barbus graellsii* is a ray-finned fish species which is endemic to Spain. It lives in rivers. It has also been introduced in Italy in some rivers where it has become well established.

This species has been very poorly assessed. There is a large data deficiency resulting in ‘unknown’ overall assessments for the Atlantic and Mediterranean region. The status in the Alpine region was assessed as ‘inadequate’, but based only on the range conclusion. All the other data were ‘unknown’. In order to improve the assessment, more data from Spain are required. This species is threatened by habitat loss and its population is considered to be declining. The IUCN conservation status is ‘Least Concern’.
