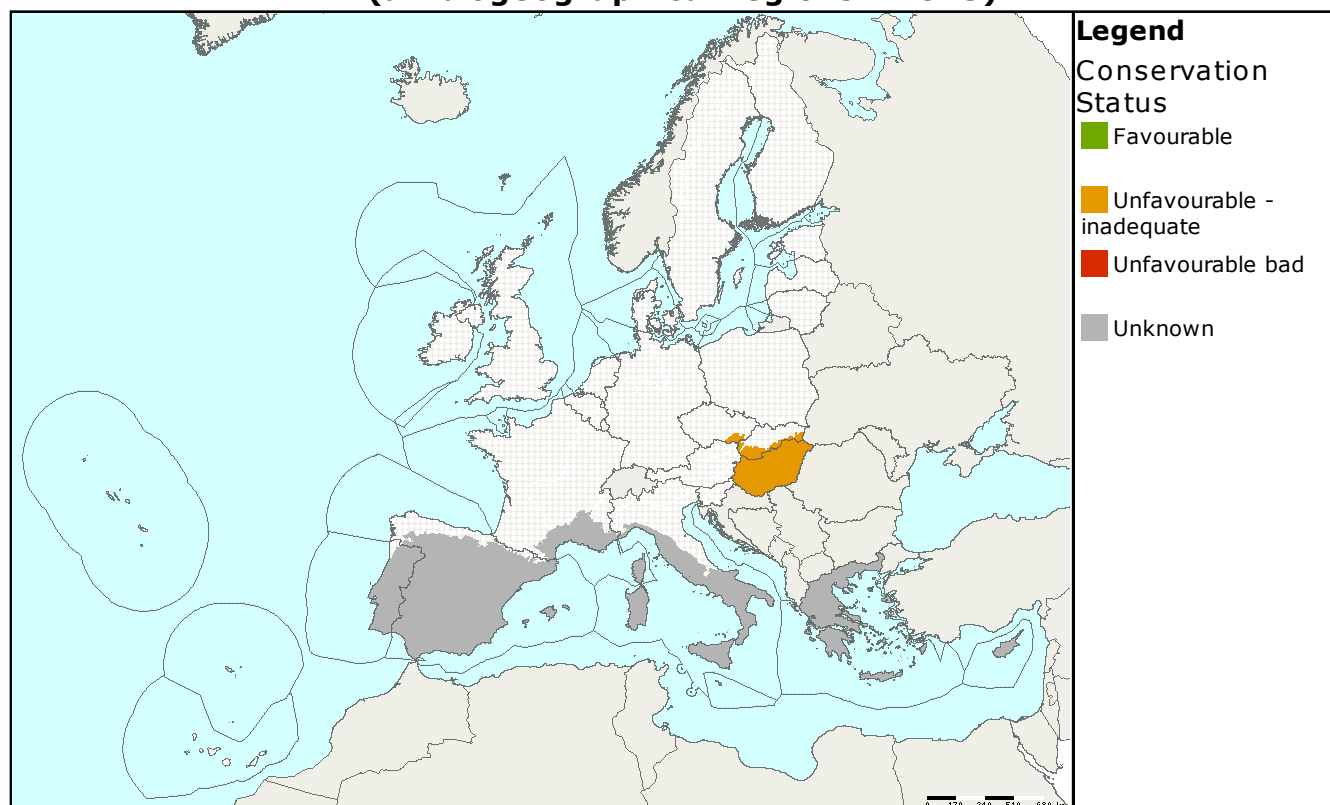

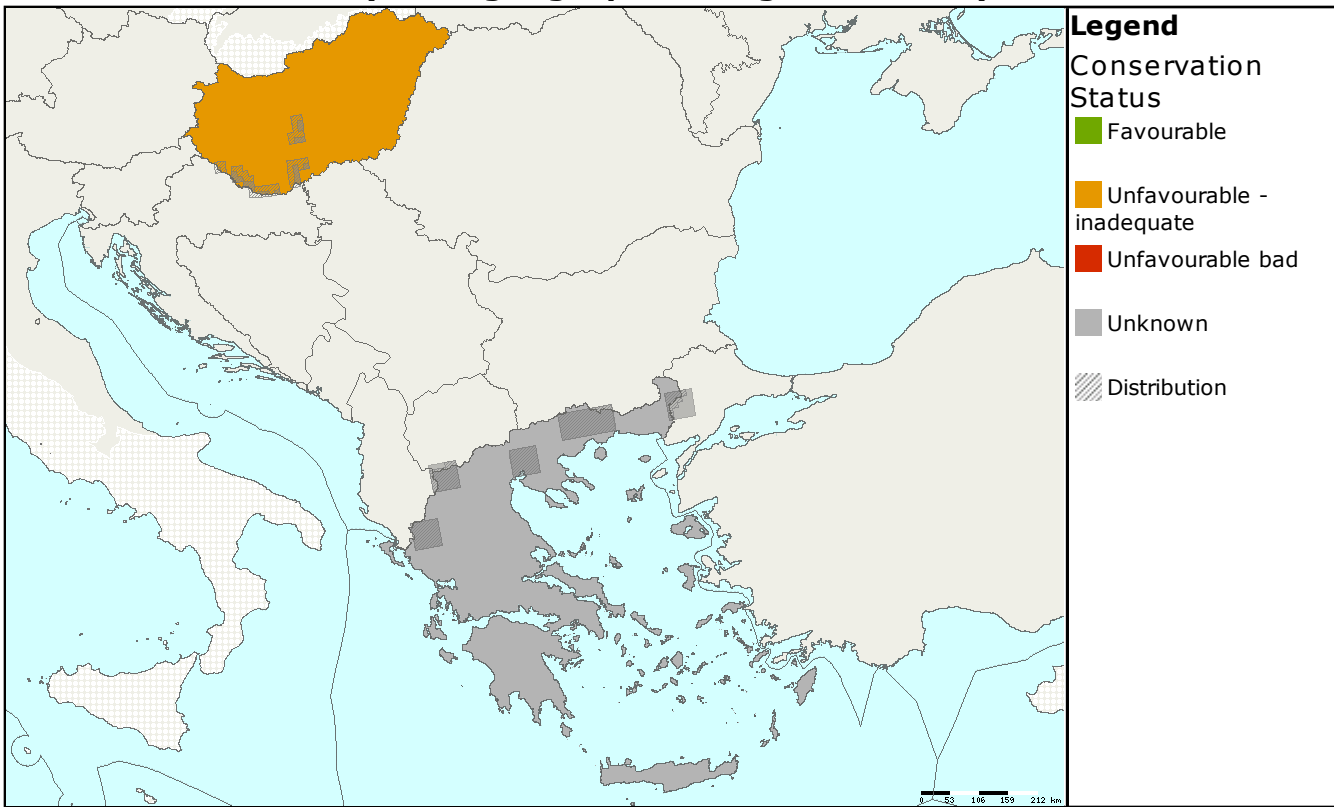

A butterfly with a discontinuous range consists of two arelas; one in south-eastern and eastern Europe and the other in western Asia. Within EU it is known as well from Austria, Bulgaria and Romania. It hosts on willows and most commonly can be found in the arborescent or shrub fringe communities of water courses.

The conservation status in the Pannonian biogeographical region is 'unfavourable inadequate'. Although the range area and population size are stable they are not sufficient to ensure long-term viability. The information provided for the Mediterranean biogeographical region is incomplete and conservation status was assessed as 'unknown'.
