



Aradus angularis is an insect living under bark of burned coniferous trees and perhaps also on fallen bark pieces. The species can be found at forest fire sites. From the Boreal biogeographical region species is known from Sweden and Finland. The majority of records are from Sweden so the overall assessment equals the Swedish report - 'unfavourable-bad'. Decline in abundance this species in Finland is probably caused by suppression of natural forest fires.
