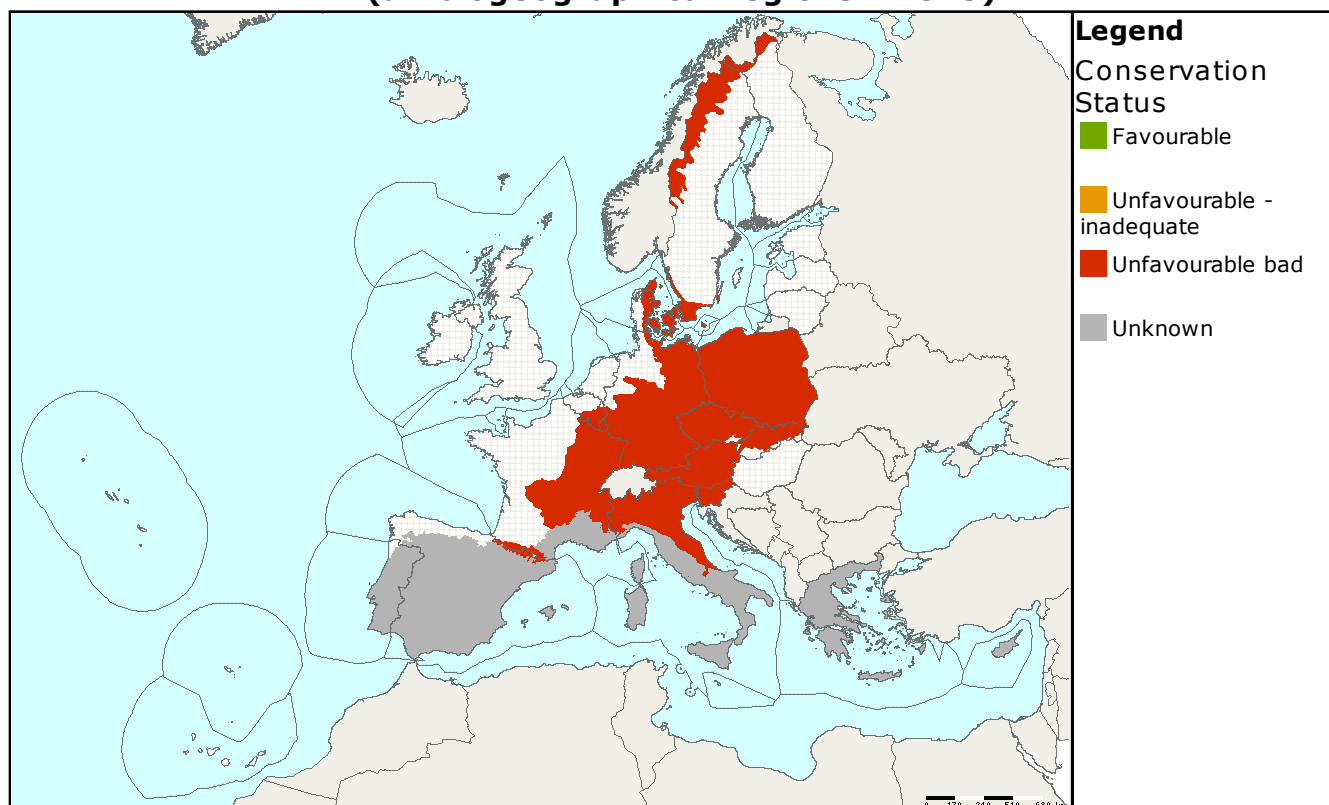

The goldstreifer is a terrestrial beetle species which is found throughout Europe, mainly southern and northern Europe, with Austria, Poland and Russia in between.

In the Alpine and Continental regions its status has been assessed as ‘bad’, which is due to the ‘bad’ overall assessment reported by Austria and Poland. The Mediterranean status for this species was largely ‘unknown’. Important data from Spain and particularly Greece are lacking. However, in Italy its overall status was assessed as ‘favourable’. The IUCN conservation status needs to be updated, but currently is ‘Vulnerable’.
