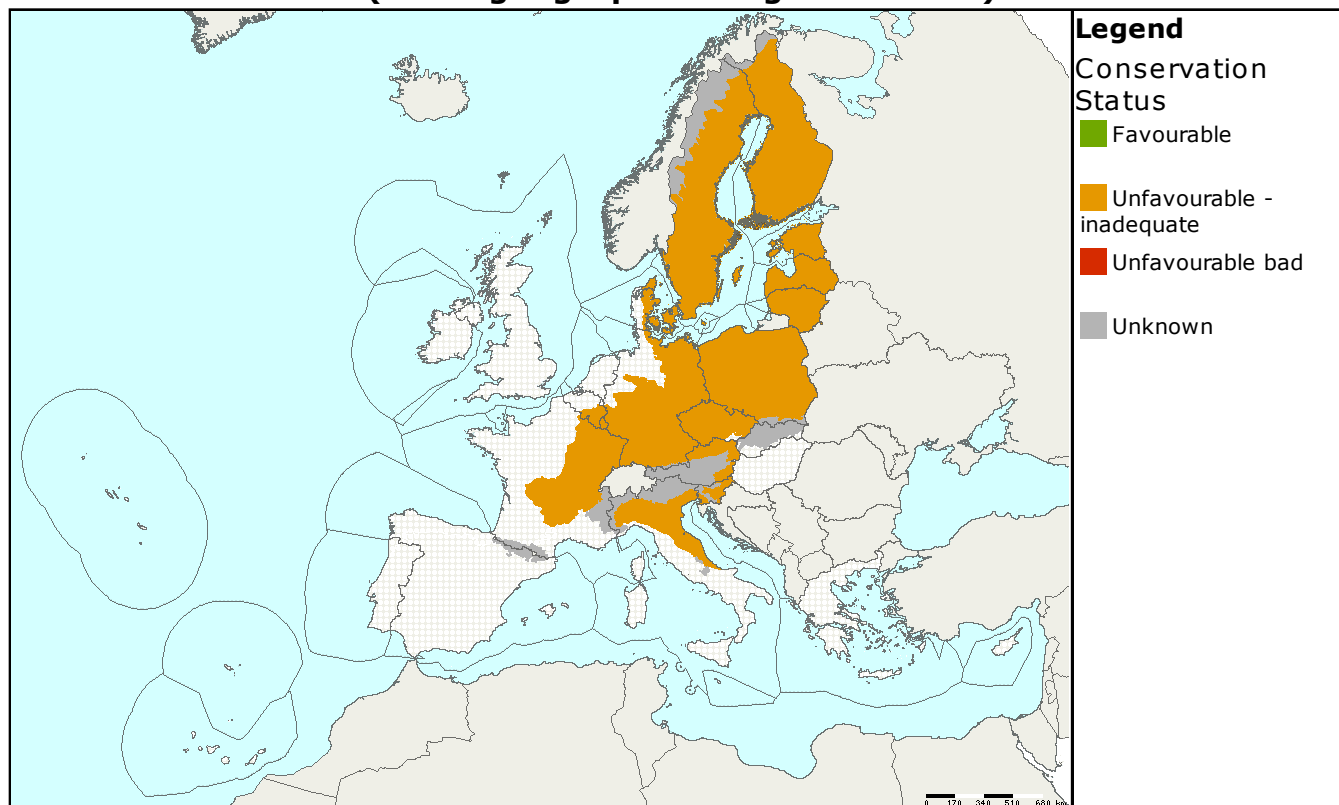

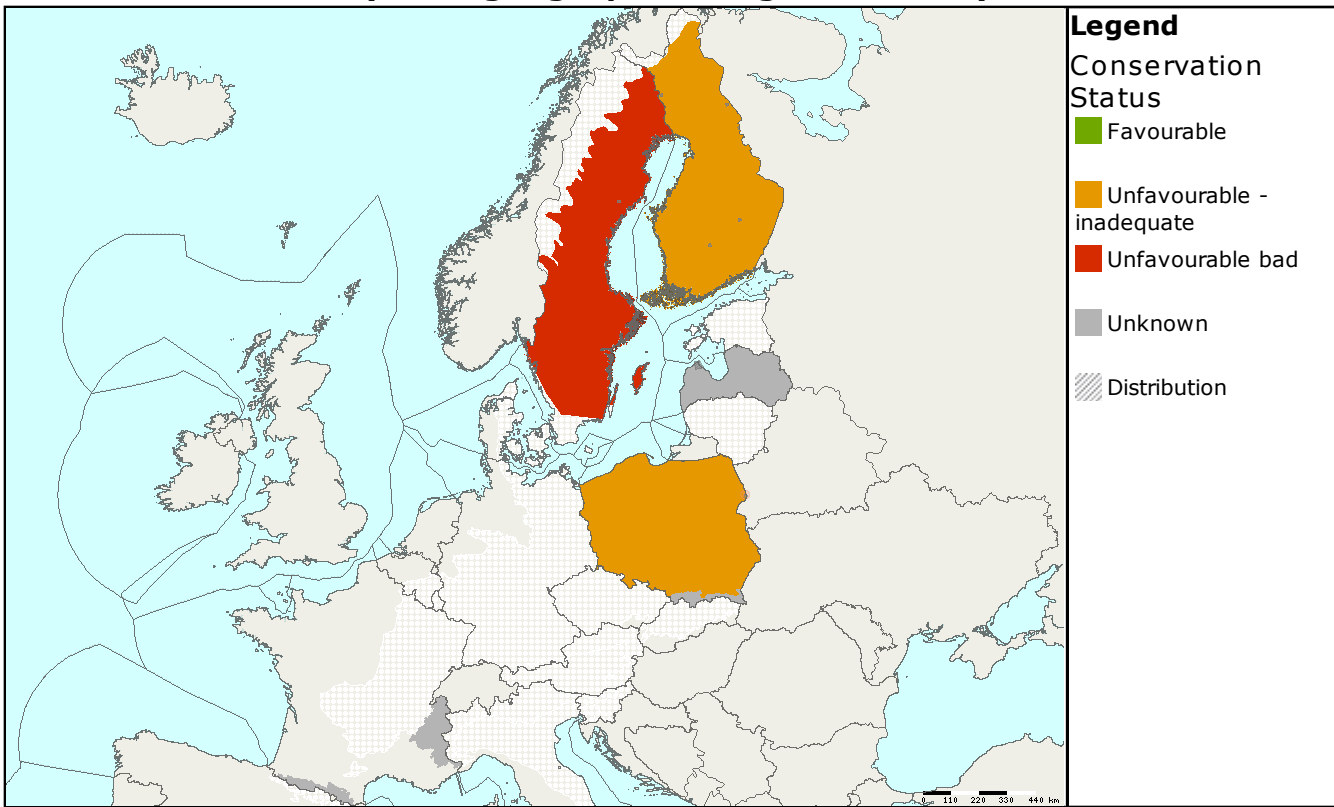

Phryganophilus ruficollis is a false darkling beetle species which is native to many European countries ranging from France to Finland. It has a preference for forests.

In the Alpine region the status of this species has been assessed as ‘unknown’, which is due to the ‘unknown’ status of this species in France and Poland. The status in the Boreal region is ‘inadequate’ but could be improved if the imported data from Latvia were more extensively reported. The overall assessment for the Continental region, in this case only Poland, is ‘inadequate’.
