



An aquatic gastropod mollusc occurring mainly in the Danube river and lower parts of its tributaries. Several references note its presence as well in the Dniester river system. Within the EU it occurs as well in Bulgaria and Romania and it is probably extinct in Austria and Slovakia. The species prefers big rivers with stony bottoms. The conservation status in the Continental biogeographical region is 'unknown'. In the Pannonian biogeographical region it was assessed as 'unfavourable inadequate' due to decrease in the range and the habitat area. These negative trends result mainly from the industrial and agricultural water pollution and negative interactions with introduced alien species.
