



The Bryde's whale is present in the Atlantic ocean with a northerly distribution range that is limited by the 40°N latitude. It is observed on a regular basis in the marine Macaronesian region around the Azores and the Canaries islands and it is believed that calving grounds may exist in the marine Macaronesian waters.

The overall assessment in the Macaronesian region is 'unknown' due to the lack of data. The species is listed as 'data deficient' in the IUCN Red List of threatened species due to taxonomical uncertainty on the species' variability.
