EU25 MMAC The blue whale occurs in the marine Atlantic and Macaronesian regions from latitudes extending from the Scotian shelf and southwards to the Canary islands. It is observed in pelagic waters up to 1,000 meters deep. In the past, the species was widely distributed in the wintering grounds of the southern North Atlantic. However, the North Atlantic population, just like the rest of the global population, has been severely depleted by whaling activities and as such the species is listed as 'endangered' in the IUCN list of

prospects

threatened species. Its conservation status in the marine Atlantic region is 'unknown' due to the lack of data and driven by the fact that the species has been reported as occurring only in the Irish Atlantic waters while no assessment was possible for the marine Macaronesian due to the lack of data and incomplete assessments by Member States.


