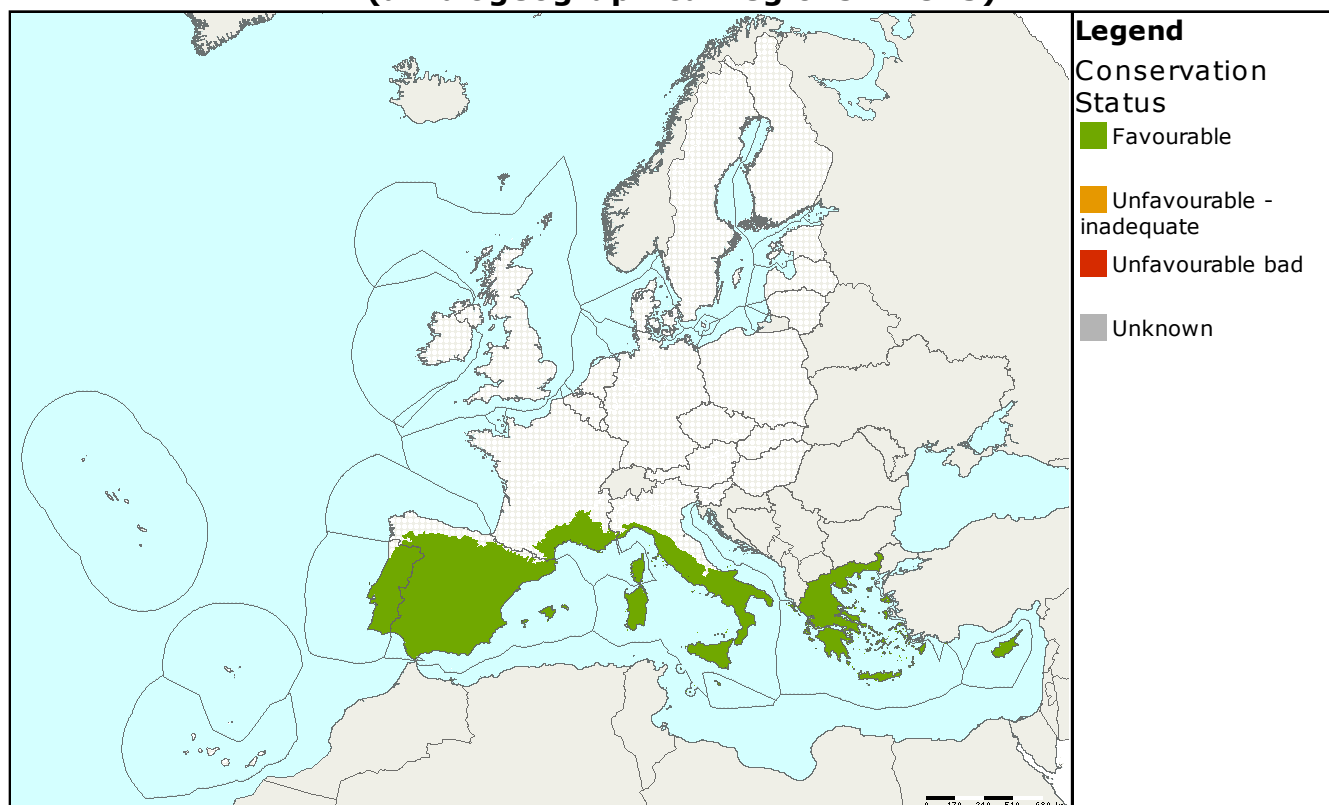

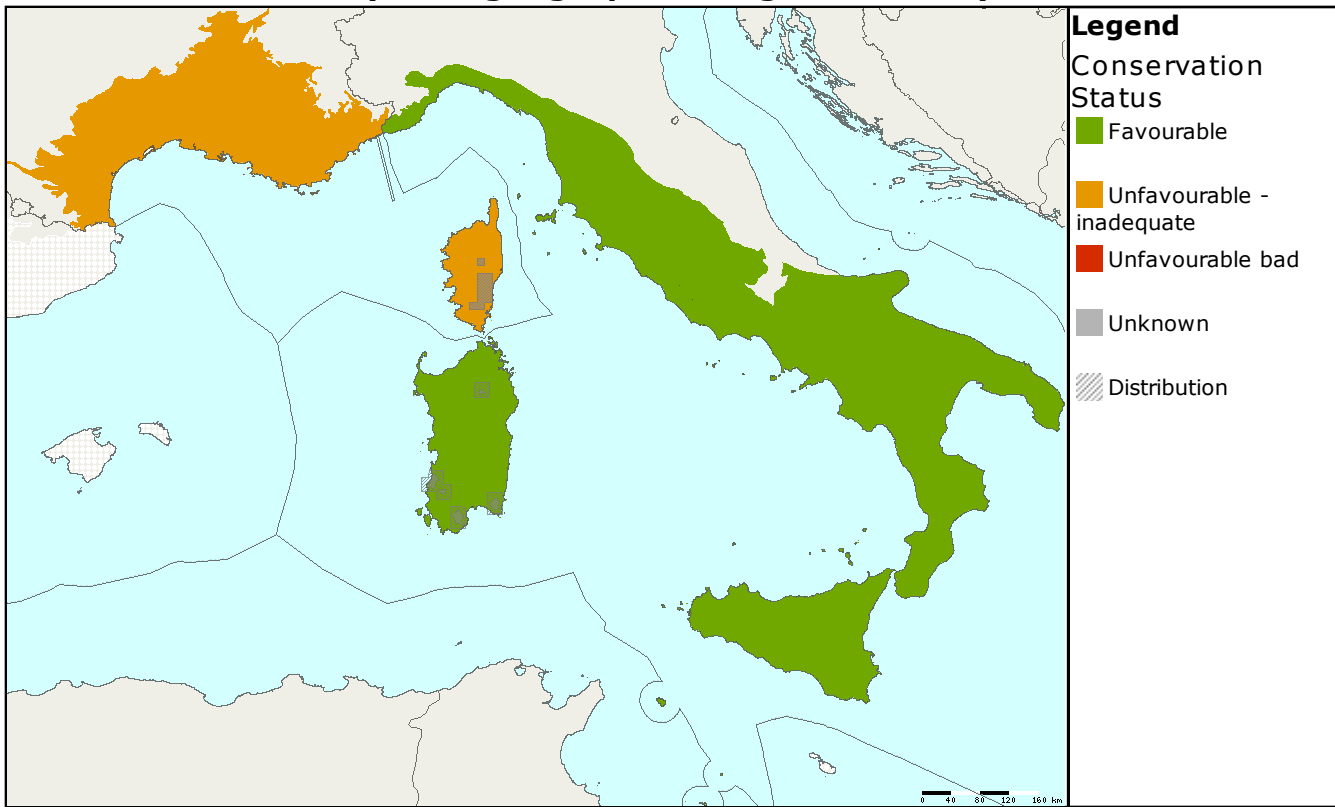

The Corsican red deer is a subspecies of red deer occurring mostly in Sardinia (Italy) where its conservation status is 'favourable'. The Corsican (France) population is relatively small (less than 4% of the total) and its conservation status is 'unfavourable-inadequate'. The biogeographical assessment is 'favourable'.
