



The white-beaked dolphin inhabits the cold temperate to subpolar waters of the continental shelf areas of the marine Atlantic region from the United Kingdom, Denmark and Sweden and as far south as France. It is most abundant in the north to northwestern part of the North Sea to western Scotland and Ireland. The largest part of the declared population is distributed in the UK while no data was submitted by Denmark where the species however exists.

The overall assessment in the marine Atlantic region is 'unknown' due to the overall biogeographic conclusion for population, habitat and future prospects parameters. The species is believed to be abundant and widespread throughout its global range and is listed as a species of 'least concern' in the IUCN Red List of threatened species.
