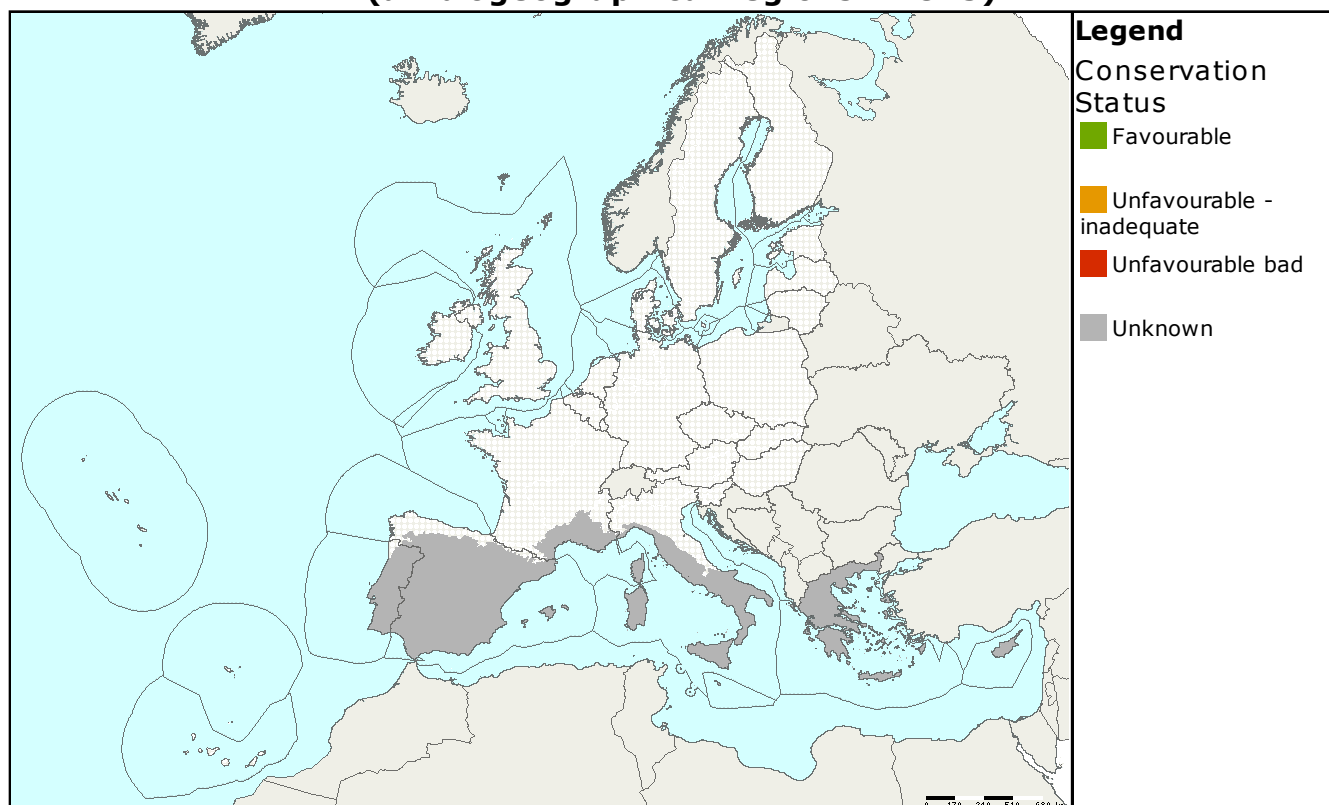

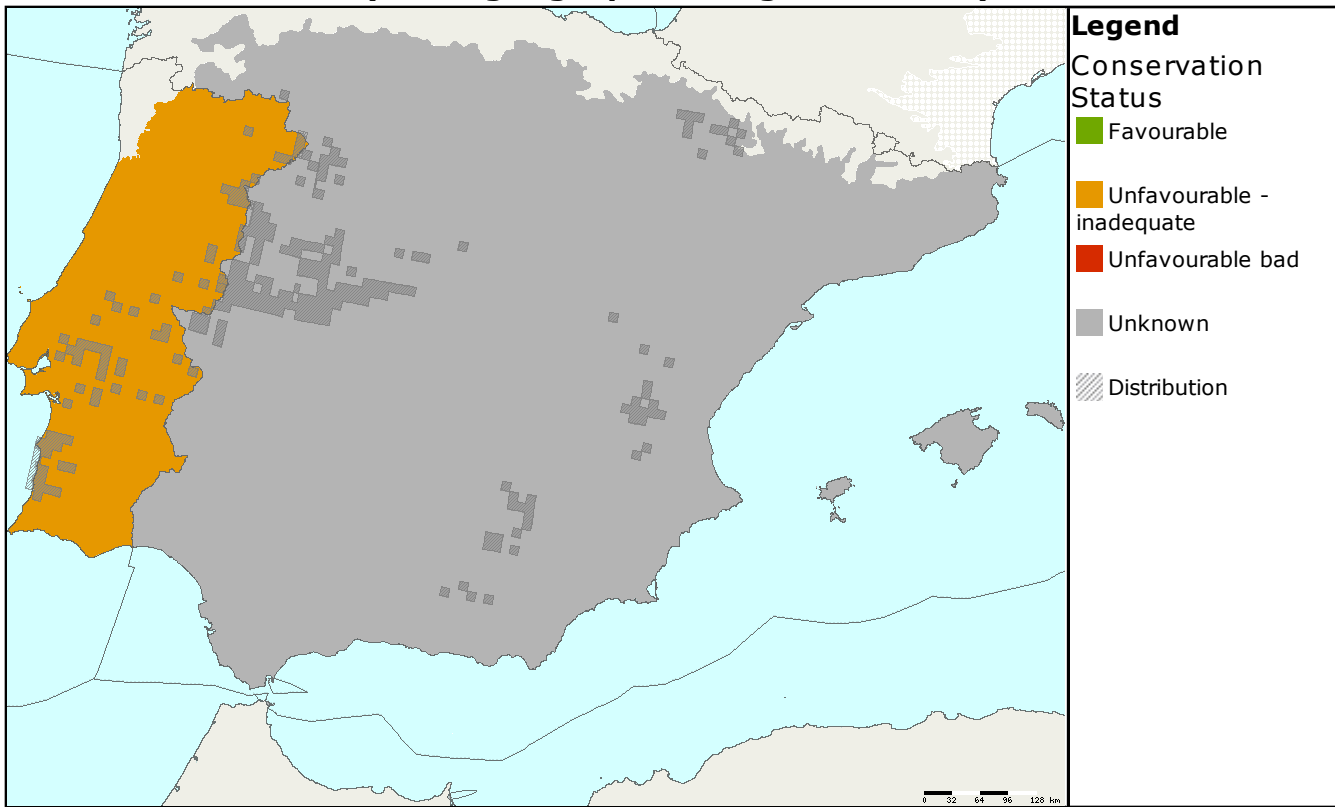

The Cabrera's vole is endemic to the Iberian Peninsula (Portugal and Spain), where it has a fragmented range. It occurs in pastures, fields and open clearings in woodland, tending to prefer damper areas than the common vole. The status of conservation for the species is assessed as "unknown but not favourable". All individual parameters are reported as "unknown" by Spain. This species has an area of occupancy that is small and potentially in decline. It is assessed as "Near Threatened" by IUCN.
