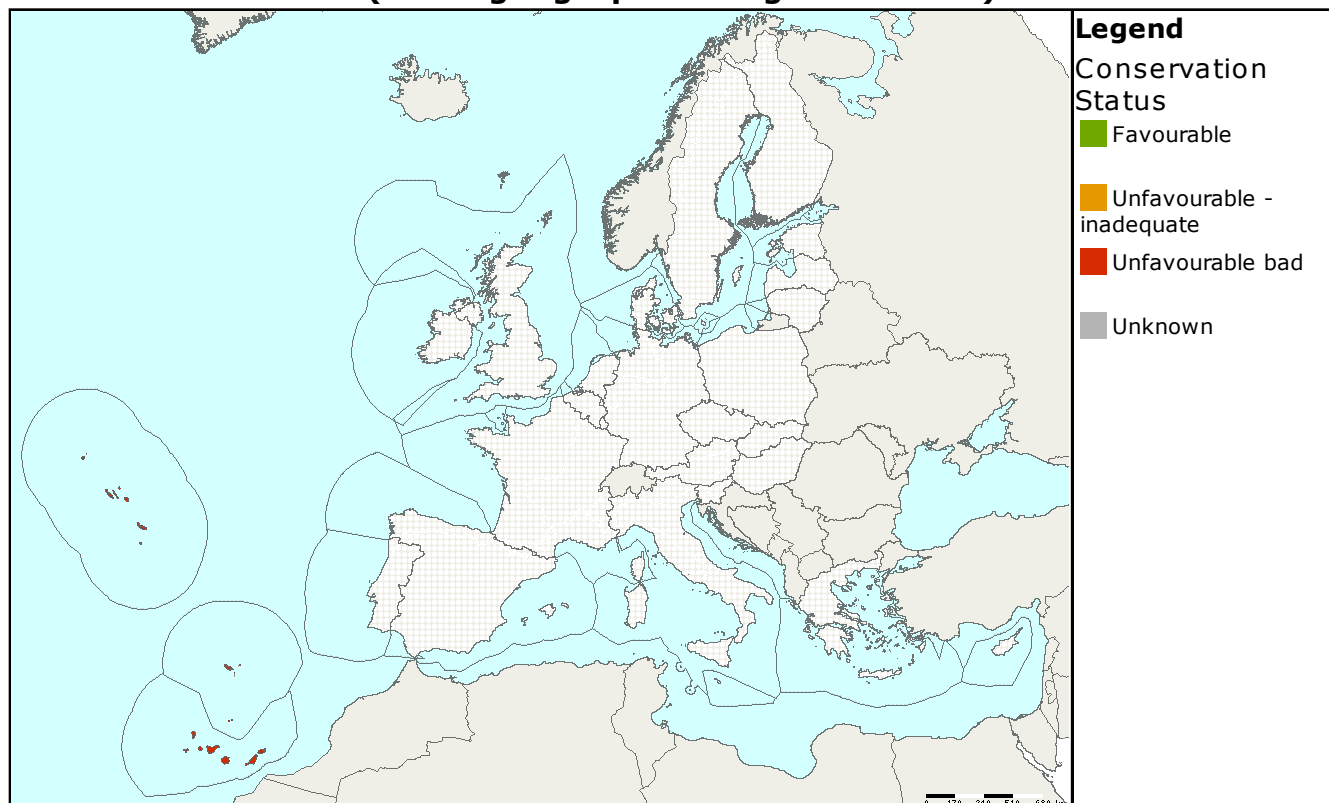

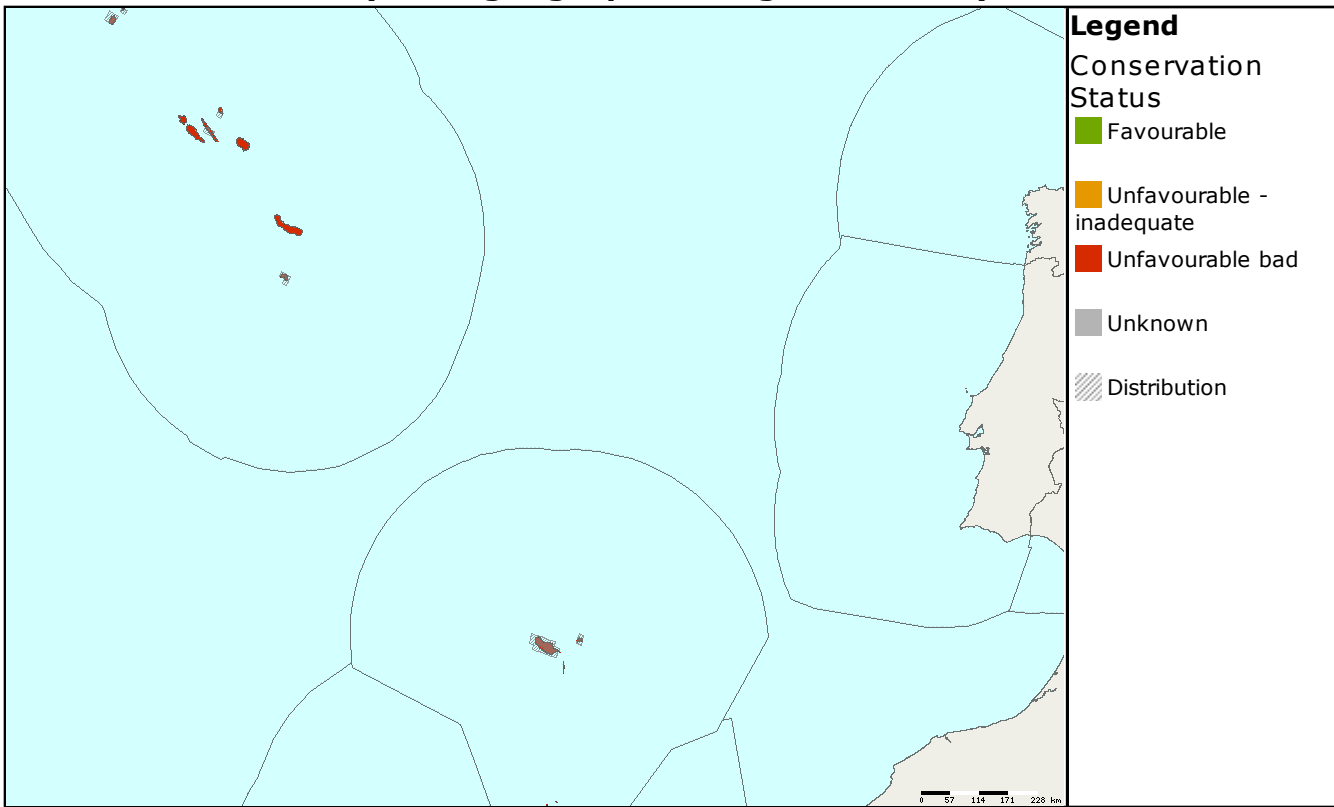

The Madeira pipistrelle is restricted to few islands in the Canaries and the Madeira Islands (and possibly the Azores). It forages over a wide range of habitats, including aquatic habitats, woodland and farmland. The status of conservation for the species is "unfavourable-bad" because of Portuguese negative report. Population, habitat and future prospects are assessed as "favourable" by Spain. The population is severely fragmented declining as a result of habitat loss, use of agricultural pesticides, and disturbance to roosts. Consequently it is assessed as "Endangered" by IUCN.
