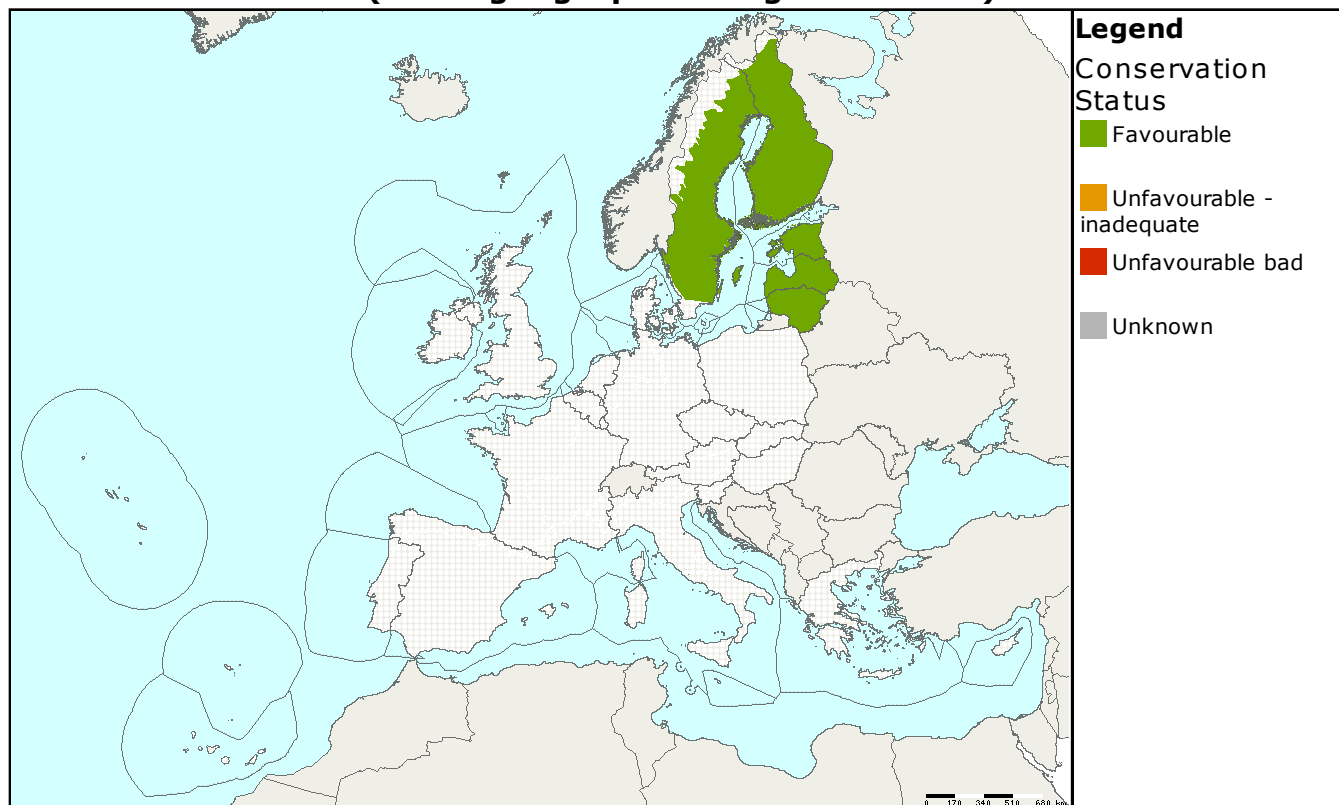

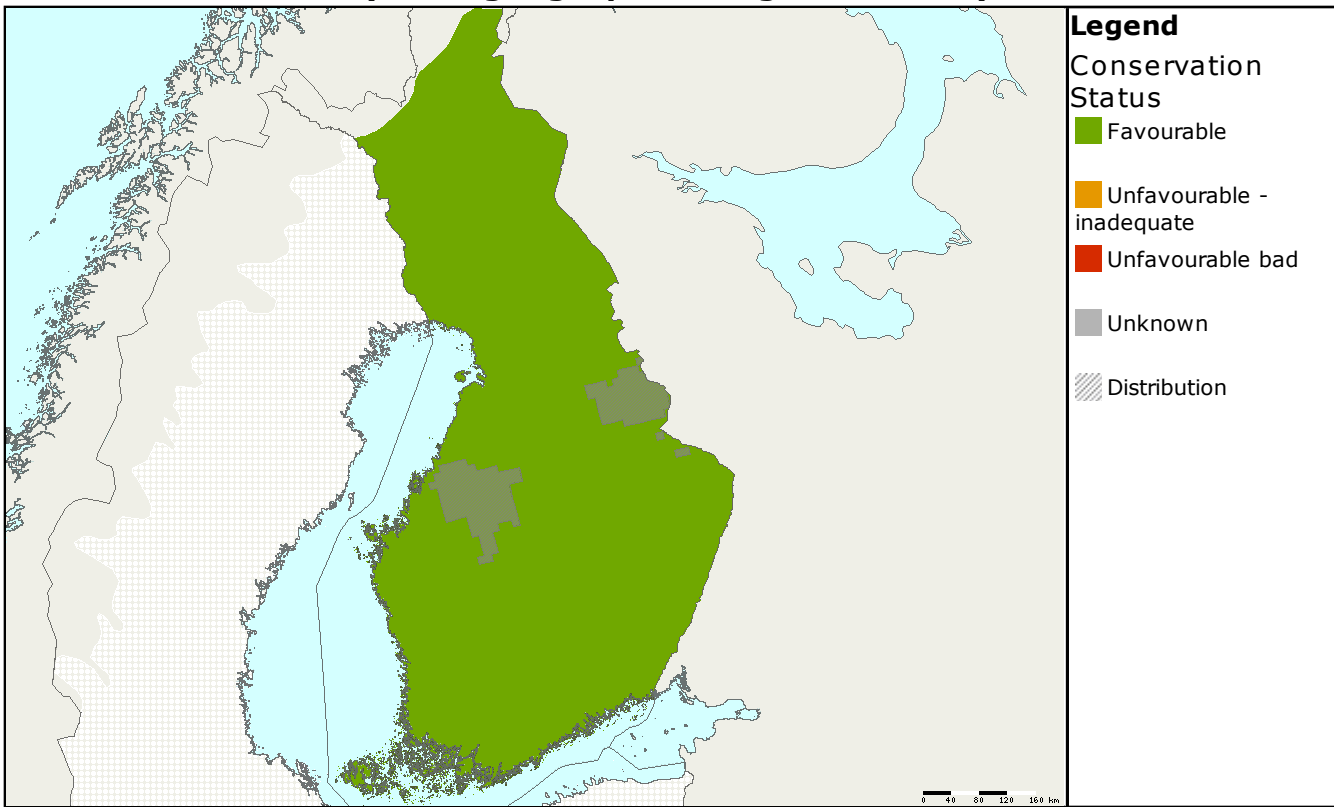
## Assessments of conservation status at the European level (all biogeographical regions - EU25)

BOR: The Forest Reindeer is assessed as being in a 'favourable' conservation status despite its relatively low numbers. The subspecies *R.t.fennicus* occurs in EU only in Finland, in two distinct genetically distinct sub-populations. The eastern has a continuation to Russian Karelia. It is concerned as LC in EU25 territory partly because of the decline of the Finnish population. Because of the recorded decline of the western sub-population and the restricted size and hunting pressure to the eastern sub-population, Finnish Association for Nature Conservation considers the Future prospect of the forest reindeer as 'unknown'.
