



The rough-toothed dolphin inhabits the tropical to subtropical deep oceanic waters of the Atlantic ocean. The species is declared as being occasional in the Portuguese marine Macaronesian waters. The overall marine Macaronesian assessment is 'unknown' and based on the Spanish data which report the species' limited presence in the Canary islands. It is possible that this species should be considered an occasional species in Spanish Macaronesian waters unless otherwise proven differently in the future. The species is listed as 'data deficient' in the IUCN Red List of threatened species.
