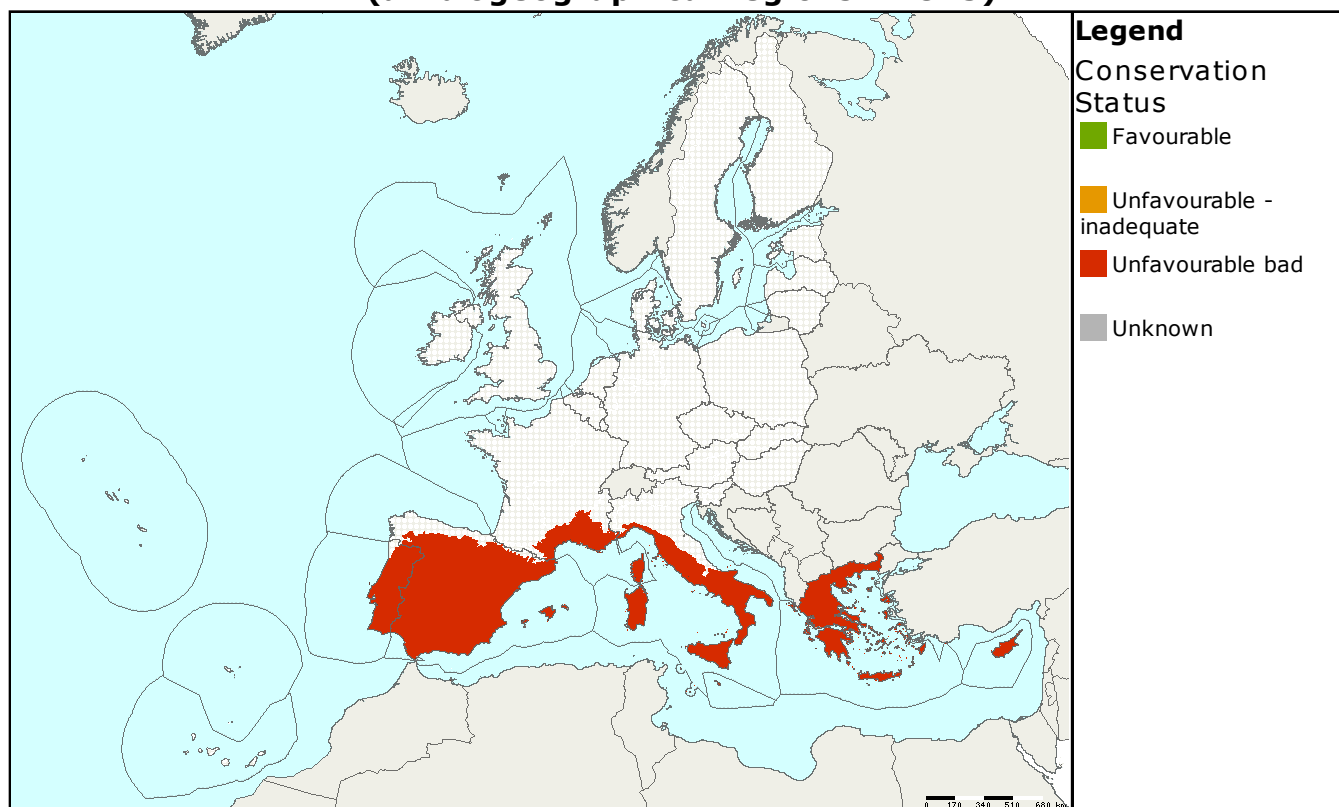

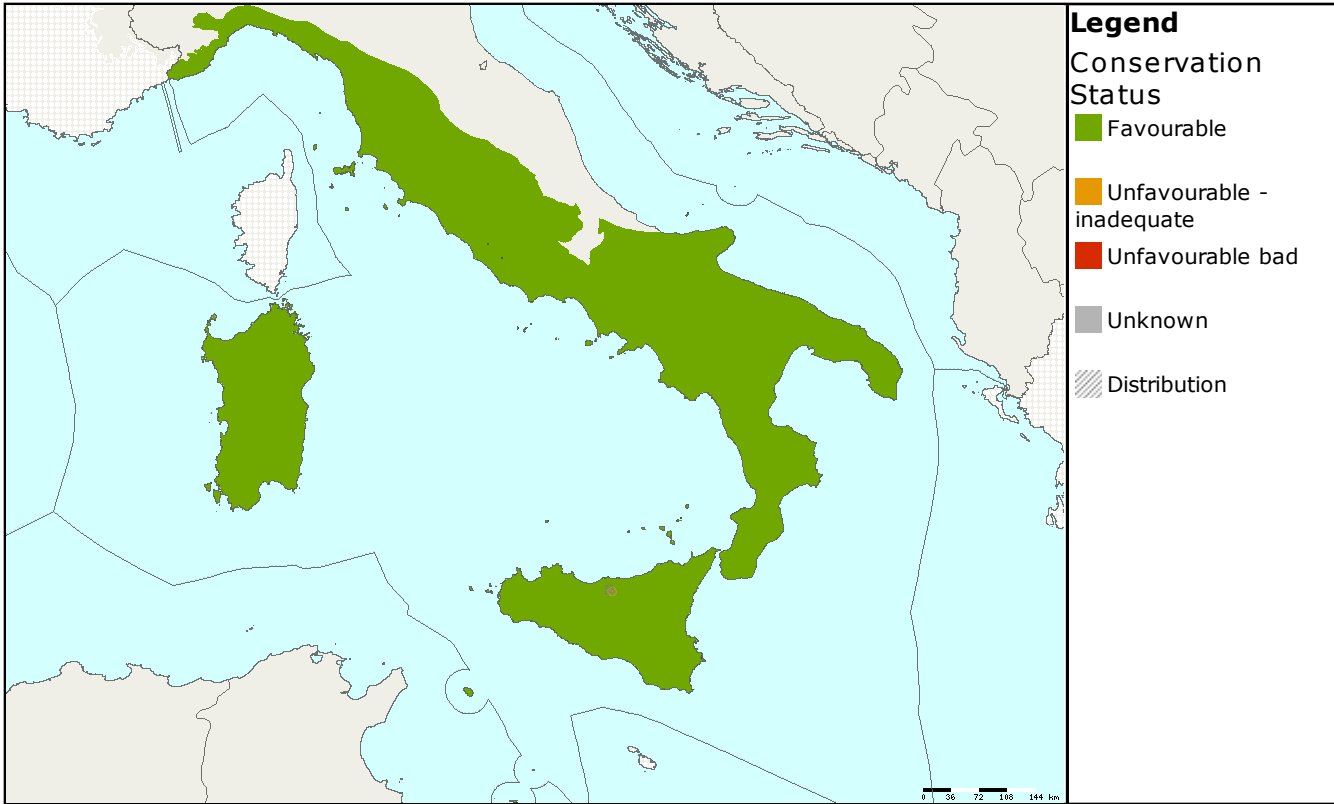

MED: Endemic to Mt. Scalone in the Madonie Mountains in the north-central part of Sicily. Thought extinct until rediscovered in 1957 Assessed as favourable by IT but with only 20-30 individuals this seems optimistic and the present day population is a fraction of that in past. Any Ref value >35 (still very low for the entire population of a sp) will lead to an assessment of 'bad but improving' Habitat of sp noted as unknown but IUCN Redlist account notes as 'degraded'.
