



Androsace pyrenaica is a flowering plant reported from the Pyrenees (Alpine region) by France and Spain. The species occupies fissures in silicate rocks in high altitudes (from 1700m up to 3000m). The overall assessment is affected by a high number of unknown values, so the final result is 'unknown'. Report from France is 'favourable'.
