



Centranthus trinervis is herbaceous species growing in the shade of rock crevices and along cliff terraces. It is endemic to Corsica (France) and Sardinia (Italy). Species is reported as 'favourable' in France but poorly known in Italy. Since Italy has approx. half of the population regional assessment is also 'unknown'. It is noted as rare and declining in the Italian Red Data Book. IUCN Red List and list of 50 of the most threatened plant species growing on Mediterranean islands both note that the species is endemic to Corsica and that the population in Italy is belonging to Centranthus amazonum species. According to IUCN the species is 'critically endangered'. Better information required
