



Encalypta mutica is a tiny moss species which occurs in Estonia, Finland and Sweden. It grows on bare soils and rocks.

In the Alpine and Continental region the status of this species is assessed as 'favourable'. However, the most important part of this species' habitat lies in the Boreal zone for which the overall status was assessed as 'unknown'. This is due to the Estonian assessment which is 'unknown'. However, the largest part of the habitat of this species lies in Sweden where it has been assessed as 'bad' for the part that lies in the Boreal zone. In addition to this the assessment of Finland ('inadequate') raises the question whether or not this species is actually doing well.
