



This red flowered lily occurs in the mountains and subalpine grasslands on calcareous rocky hillsides of the Maritime Alps. It is known from southern France and north-western Italy. It is considered to be endemic to this region, although some sources refer to its possible occurrence in Spain.

In both the Alpine and the Mediterranean biogeographical region the conservation status is 'favourable'; the population size, the range area and the habitat area are stable and sufficient to ensure long-term viability of the populations. Neither in France nor in Italy is it considered endangered. However, because of the decorative qualities of its flowers it is threatened by collecting.
