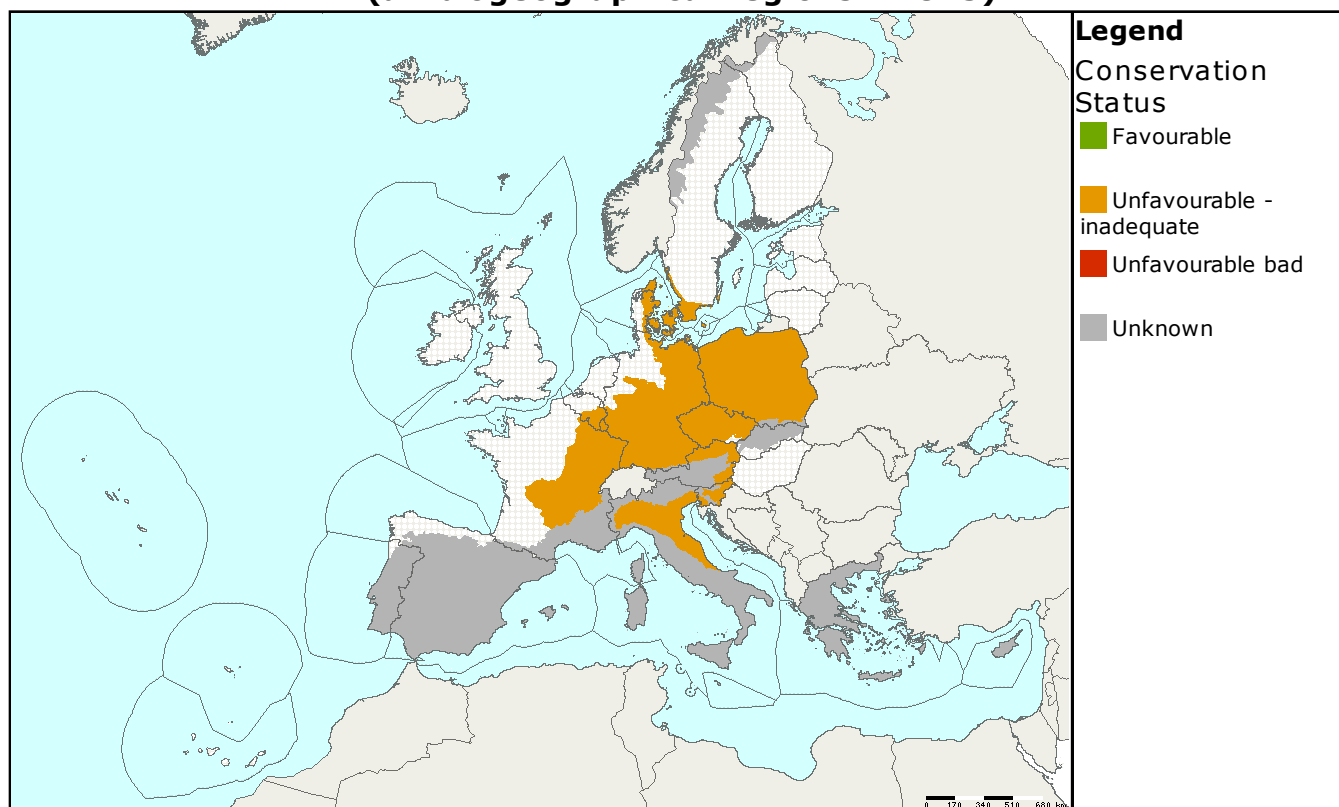

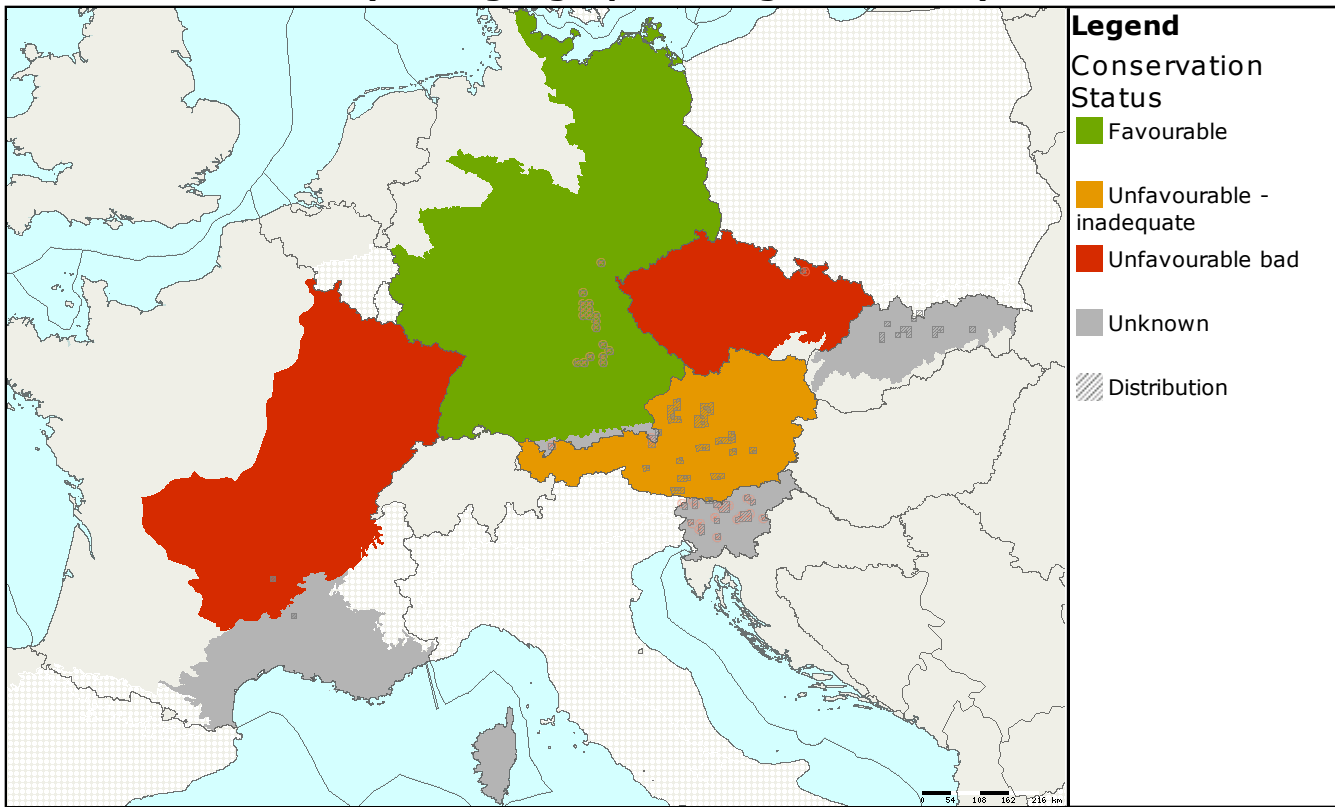

The *Mannia triandra* is a species of liverwort which is a plant that is mainly spread across Central Europe.

In the Alpine region the status of this species was assessed as ‘unknown but not favourable’. In the Continental region it was assessed as unfavourable ‘inadequate’. A very small share of its range falls under the Mediterranean region (France) for which this species’ status was assessed as ‘unknown’. The country that hosts the largest part of this species’ range, Germany, is the only country with a ‘favourable’ status for this species. A major data deficiency exists for Slovenia.
