



Riccia breidleri is a moss species with most localities found in France (six). It is reported in Alpine region by France, Austria and Italy. French assessment is 'unfavourable-bad' due to bad future prospects. The species is reported as regressive due to climate change (particularly significant in mountain regions). In Austria and Italy, only three localities are found. In Italy, the species is reported as very poorly known. Overall assessment is 'unfavourable-bad'.
