



The shore dock (Rumex rupestris) is a plant growing on upper shores or in wet hollows in sand dunes. It is endemic to coastal regions of south-west Great Britain, western France and north western Spain (Atlantic region). Little information is reported by Spain, but excluding Spain from the regional assessment does not alter the overall assessment. Overall regional assessment is 'unfavourable-inadequate' due to poor habitat and future prospects in France. In the United Kingdom the species is considered 'favourable'. Species is noted as 'endangered' in Spanish Red Data Book.
