



The summer lady's-tresses is an orchid occuring in central and western Europe. Overall assessments for Atlantic and Continental regions are 'unfavourable-bad' with 'favourable' situation reported from Italy and 'favourable' future prospects from Germany. For Alpine region assessment is 'unfavourable-inadequate'. For some countries in Mediterranean region species distribution is not well known. Overall assessment is 'unknown'. However in Italy, the species status was assessed as 'favourable' thanks to stable trend of 'range' and 'population' parameters. In Greece, presence of the species is not confirmed. Species was not assessed by IUCN.
